The OMB estimates were calculated in a manner consistent with scoring guidance provided in the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1990.

Although key provisions of the Budget Enforcement Act of 1990, as amended, expired on September 30, 2002, OMB will continue to release reports to provide official and public notification of OMB scoring of enacted appropriations.

Military Personnel: Each Military Personnel account includes language requiring a portion of its enacted appropriation to be paid to the Defense Military Retirement Fund, which is a mandatory program that provides compensation to severely disabled retirees. Although CBO and OMB have no overall BA difference for the total amount appropriated to these accounts, CBO and OMB have different estimates of these mandatory payments, resulting in the discretionary differences listed below.

Operation and Maintenance, Defense-wide OMB scores the effects of Sec. 8135 in each of the Defense-wide accounts, while CBO scores the entire amount in two placeholder accounts. Section 8135 rescinds \$1.374 billion from funds made available in Titles II, III, and IV, and cuts an additional \$300 million from Titles III and IV, without specifying where these cuts should be taken. In addition, OMB scores \$8 million for Sec. 8021 (Indian Financing Act) in this account, while CBO scores these funds in a placeholder account. There is no actual difference between OMB and CBO in the scoring of Sec. 8021. OMB has lower estimates of outlays from new authority (-\$510 million) and higher estimates of outlays from prior-year authority (+\$156 million) than CBO.	-679	-35
