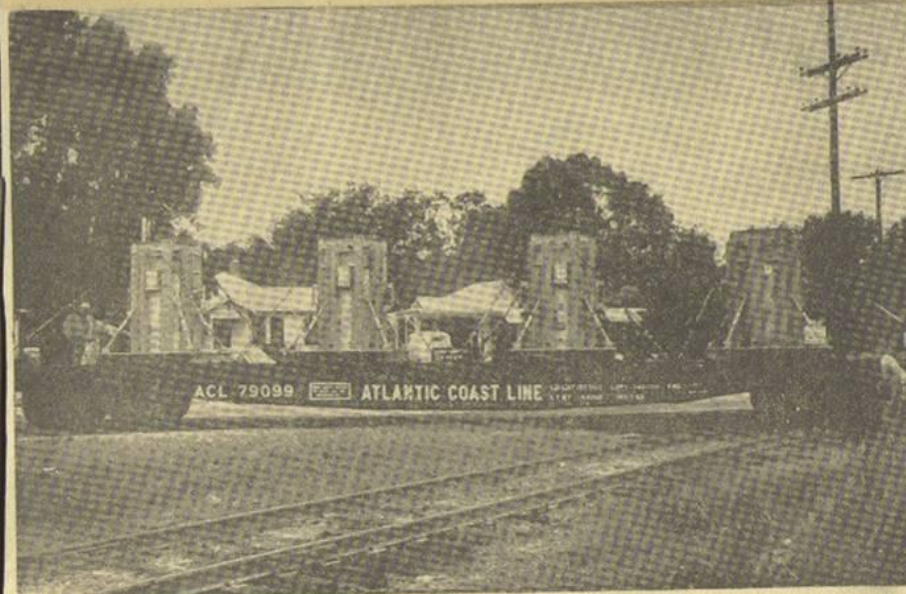

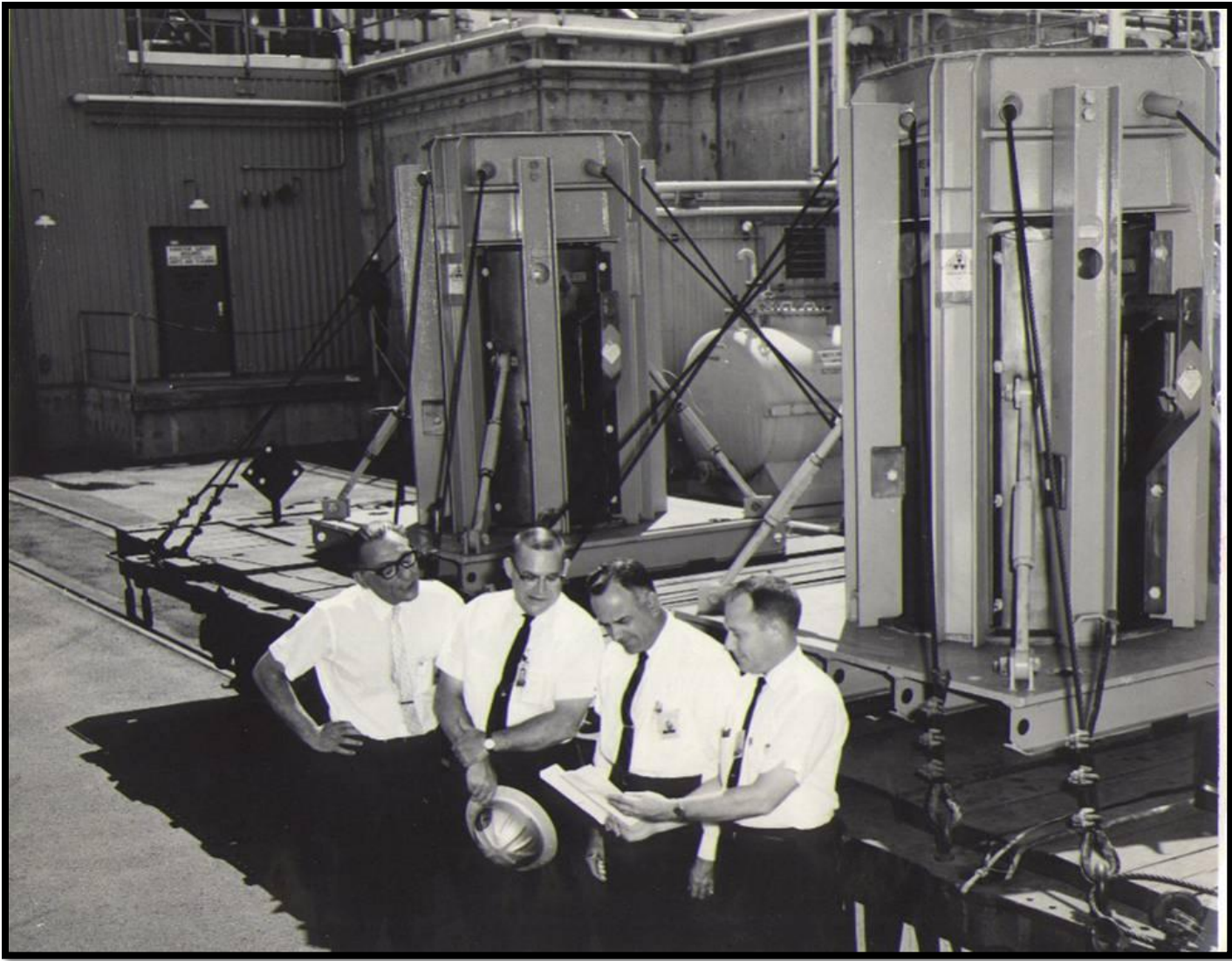

Atomic Shipment Heads West

The first shipment of spent atomic reactor fuel to be returned to the U.S. under the Atoms for Peace program moves through Garden City on a specially constructed flat car. Enclosed in the four 12½-ton

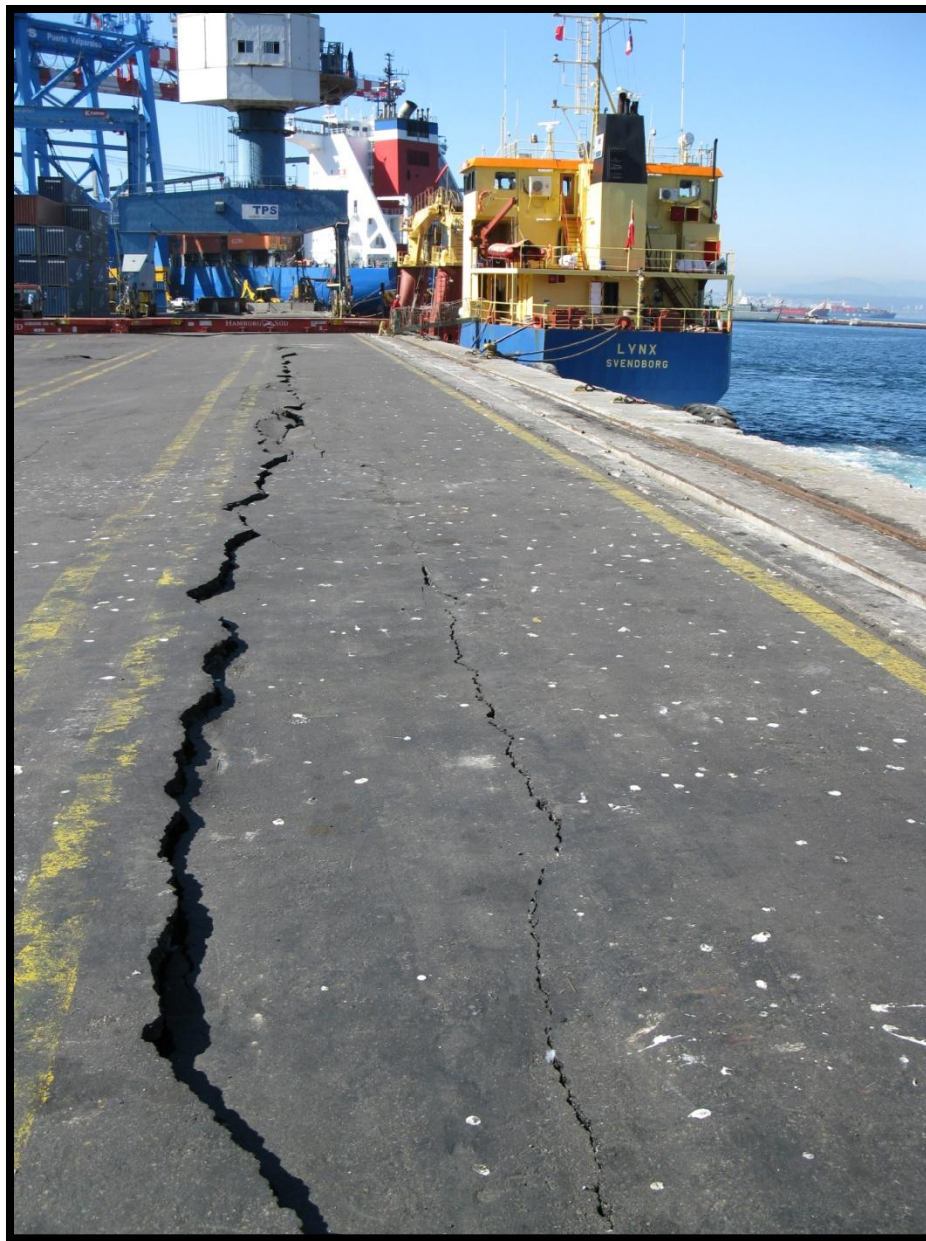
