Research Approach

- Survey research conducted by Hank Jenkins-Smith(1994-1997) to understand:
 - Knowledge
 - ♦ Trust
 - Credibility
 - Information sources
- Shipments studied:
 - Cesium Colorado to Hanford
 - Foreign Research Reactor (FRR) Urgent Relief Shipment -Wilmington, NC to Savannah River, SC
 - FRR shipment -Concord, CA to INEEL, ID

Survey Results

Knowledge = confidence
State and local officials most trusted
Federal Departments of Transportation and Energy were viewed as competent

 Media most frequent source of information

 Keeping commitments very important (FRR)

How Shipment Plans Changed

Cesium:

- States delivered training
- Local media involvement
- Safety stressed rather than risk
- Urgent Relief Shipments:
 - State radiological inspections
 - Linked to treaty commitments
- Concord, CA FRR:
 - Route selection a joint effort
 - Local officials managed public meetings
 - Survey directed by local officials

Manage Risk by Performing Well

- Update social science research
- Establish Institutional relationships early
- Provide funding for emergency training (Section 180(c)
- Third-party regulation of transportation for program credibility and consistency with the commercial world
- Demonstrate shipment safety
- Keep commitments and agreements
