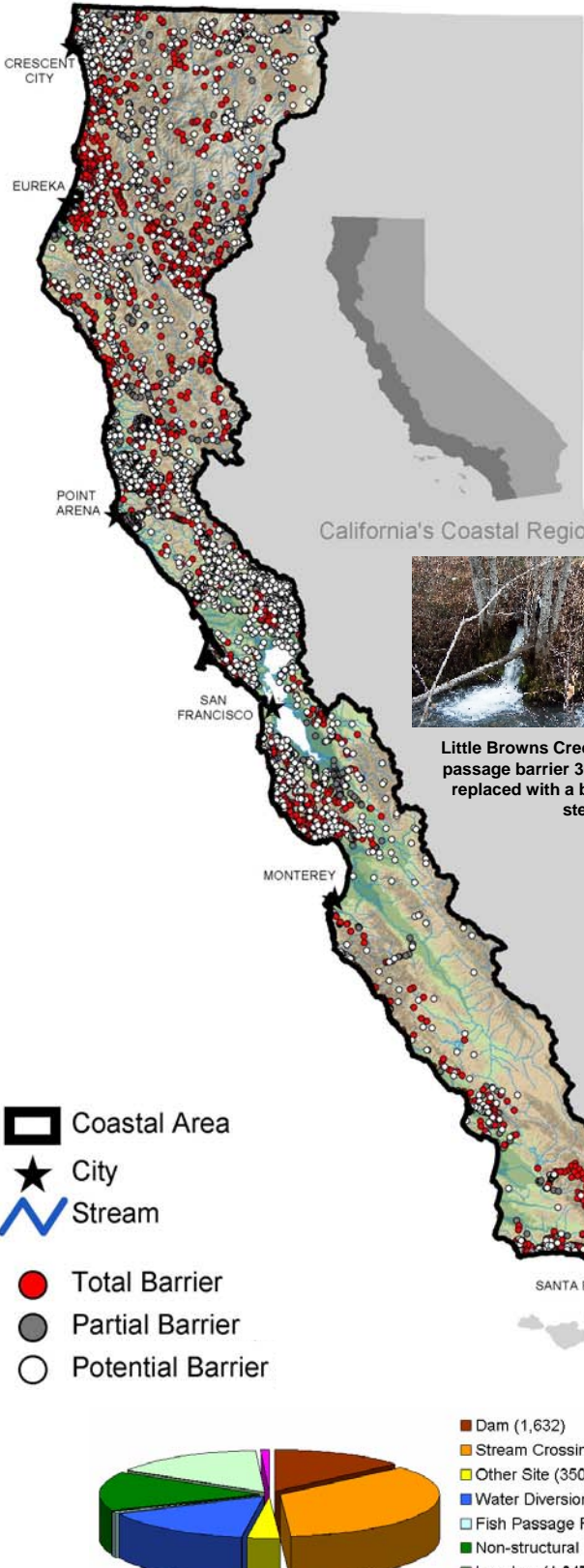


# CALIFORNIA FISH PASSAGE FORUM

The mission of the Fish Passage Forum is to protect and restore listed anadromous salmonid species, and other aquatic organisms, in California by promoting the collaboration among public and private sectors for fish passage improvement projects and programs. Species of concern include: coho and chinook salmon, and steelhead trout.

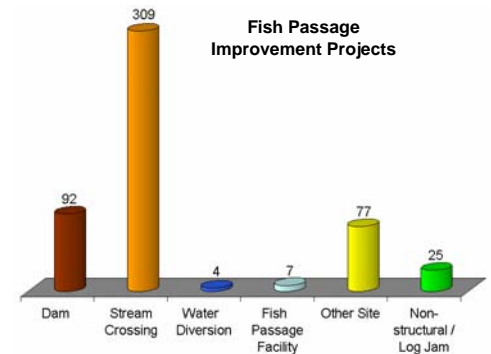


## CALIFORNIA FISH PASSAGE FORUM

- An association of public, private and government organizations.
- Assists private landowners, community groups, and public agencies in efforts to remove migration barriers and restore currently inaccessible habitat.
- Works to coordinate and streamline permits required for restoration.
- Conducts workshops that provide design and project implementation assistance.
- Seeks long-term funding for fish passage projects.
- Develops education programs to increase public support for fish passage work.



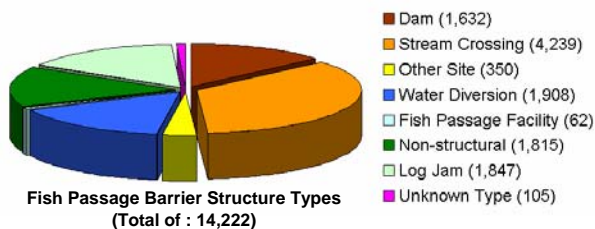
Little Browns Creek, Weaver Creek, Trinity River. A fish passage barrier 300 ft long culvert with 8-foot jump was replaced with a bridge. 2.5 miles of historic coho and steelhead habitat opened.



## STATEWIDE FISH PASSAGE BARRIER INVENTORY

- Compiles over one hundred data sources into a common map-based database.
- Allows past and future barrier assessments to be standardized and stored at one place.
- Serves as a starting point for analyses of fish passage barriers in relation to each other and in the context of a watershed.
- Enables proactive identification of barriers suitable for removal or modification.
