COMMISSIONER SMITH: And just another question. So was there a reason in those -- in that five-year demonstrate, to not look at risk or sort of risky sexual behavior in the institutional settings?

DR. POTTER: Well, for the most part, the people who were enrolled in our project to receive services, were enrolled after they had been diagnosed. So I -- you know, whether they came in with the disease in some instances, that was really a state-by-state decision for those people. And then so much of this is falling back on the states in a coordination and collaboration to -- correction, public health agencies and other agencies.
