About The Project

The last comprehensive survey on Medicaid and CHIP among low-income parents was conducted in 2000.

Much has changed. Enrollment methods. Preferences. CHIP growth. State budget cuts. Recession.

Reconnect with Medicaid/CHIP target audience in 2011 survey:

- Awareness of Medicaid and CHIP
- Barriers to enrollment
- Motivations for enrollment
- Preferences for enrollment modes
- Feedback on messengers and outreach vehicles
- Satisfaction and views toward experiences with Medicaid and CHIP coverage

About The Survey

Survey of 1,936 parents of children under 19 in households below 250% FPL.

- 1,507 conducted in English
- 429 conducted in Spanish
- 628 parents of uninsured child
- 638 with a child in Medicaid or CHIP
- 611 with a child in employer coverage

Fielded April 22 through June 10, 2011.

Margin of error on total results: + 2.2 percentage points.

#1 Most Are Aware of and Feel Positive Toward Medicaid/CHIP

Of parents never having a child in Medicaid or CHIP:

- 88% have heard of "Medicaid"
- Name other than "Medicaid" (e.g., "Medi-Cal"): 62%
- Unique CHIP name (e.g., "Healthy Families"): 74%


Seven in ten say Medicaid/CHIP programs are very or somewhat good.

Those who are most favorable include:

- Parents who have experience with the program
- Spanish-speaking parents
- Lower-income (<150% FPL) parents
- Less-educated parents


#2 Majority Very Satisfied with Medicaid/CHIP Coverage

#3 Top Motivations to Enrollment

Getting peace of mind (71% very motivating)

Child having:

- Regular doctor (70%)
- Access to prescription drugs (69%)
- Access to dental care (68%)
- Access to vision care (65%)
- Access to mental health services (56%)

A top motivator for those with a child currently enrolled in Medicaid/CHIP was finding out the coverage was something they could afford (70% very motivating).

#4 Top Barriers to Enrollment

Think enrollment process would be hard (51% very or somewhat hard)

 Including 43% of those who have enrolled in past

My families' income is too high (42% agree)

- 150% 250% FPL (52%)
- 100% 150% FPL (37%)
- <100% FPL (21%)
- English-speakers (48% vs. 19% of Spanish-speakers)


I could afford Medicaid/CHIP (16% disagree)

 Spanish-speakers disagree (35% disagree vs. 11% of English-speaking parents) Do not know where to find information about Medicaid or CHIP

- Employer coverage (45%)
- Uninsured (34%)
- Do not know where to apply
- Employer coverage (51%)
- Uninsured (33%)

#5 Overall Enrollment Preferences


Percent saying they would be much or somewhat more likely to apply if it meant doing so by...



However, there are big differences among subgroups....


#5 Enrollment Preferences: Gov't Office

Percent saying much or somewhat more likely to apply if it meant doing so online




Would trust "a lot" about whether to sign up for Medicaid or CHIP



#7 Preferred Outreach Vehicles


Where would you want to get information about Medicaid or CHIP



Satisfaction with enrollment process




Ease of enrollment




#9 Difficulty with enrollment

#10 Perceptions and Experiences with Renewal

Do you have to do something to renew your child's Medicaid/CHIP insurance every so often?




Least likely to know about renewal:

- Parents 150% to 250% FPL (57% vs. 72% <150% FPL)
- English speakers (64% vs. 76% of Spanish speakers)
- Has not received help from other public programs (59% vs. 71%)


N = 871 parents aware of having to renew Medicaid/CHIP
