Close Big Oil Tax Loopholes Act and Offshore Production and Safety Act—Agreement: A unanimous-consent-time agreement was reached providing that at 2:15 p.m., on Tuesday, May 17, 2011, the Majority Leader be recognized to move to proceed to consideration of S. 940, to reduce the Federal budget deficit by closing big oil tax loopholes, and S. 953, to authorize the conduct of certain lease sales in the Outer Continental Shelf, to amend the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act to modify the requirements for exploration; that there be up to four hours of debate prior to a vote on the motion to proceed to consideration of S. 940; that the vote on the motion to proceed be subject to a 60 vote threshold; provided further, that at 10:30 a.m., on Wednesday, May 18th, 2011, Senate resume consideration of the motion to proceed to consideration of S. 953, to authorize the conduct of certain lease sales in the Outer Continental Shelf, to amend the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act to modify the requirements for exploration; that there be up to four hours of debate prior to a vote on the motion to proceed to consideration of S. 953; that the vote on the motion to proceed be subject to a 60 vote threshold; if a motion to proceed contained in this agreement does not achieve 60 affirmative votes, the motion be withdrawn; and that the time for debate on the motions to proceed to S. 940 and S. 953, be equally divided in the usual form.
