Mark P. Mills is a technology forecaster, a Senior Fellow of the Manhattan Institute and CEO of the Digital Power Group, a techcentric advisory group. He was formerly the chief tech strategist for a boutique venture fund, and cofounded and served as chairman and CTO of ICx Technologies helping take it public in a 2007 IPO. He is a member of the advisory board of Northwestern University's School of Engineering and serves on the board of directors of the Marshall Institute.

Mills writes a regular column for *Forbes* and is coauthor of the book *The Bottomless Well* (Basic Books, 2005) which rose to #1 in Amazon's science rankings and about which Bill Gates said: "This is the only book I've ever seen that really explains energy." He has been published widely, including *The Wall Street Journal* and *The New York Times Magazine*, and has appeared frequently on TV including CNN, FOX News, CNBC, PBS, NBC, and ABC, and on *The Daily Show with Jon Stewart*.

Mills was earlier a technology adviser for Banc of America Securities, and a coauthor of a successful tech investment newsletter. He has testified before the U.S. Congress and briefed many state public service commissions and state legislators. Mills served in the White House Science Office under President Ronald Reagan. Early in his career he was an experimental physicist and process development engineer in microprocessor, fiber optics, defense, and solid-state devices, where he holds several patents. Mills has a degree in physics from Queen's University, Canada.
