Colin C. Carriere serves as general counsel to the Amtrak Office of Inspector General. He has practiced law for more than 30 years. He has litigated cases in state and federal courts and provided legal advice and counsel to various entities and bodies. His experience ranges from litigating civil matters on a variety of topics, to providing advice on corporate and personal issues to consulting and providing legal advice on complex fraud investigations and criminal matters.

He has been with the Amtrak OIG since 1991, having served the office for about 20 years. While with the Amtrak OIG, he has been responsible for overseeing investigations and providing legal assistance to the IG and employees of the office on a broad range of matters that the OIG encounters, including criminal, civil, administrative and human resources issues.

Mr. Carriere has previously worked as a trial attorney for the U.S. Department of Justice, environmental enforcement section; senior trial counsel for the U.S. Department of Energy, Office of Special Counsel; trial attorney for the District of Columbia attorney general's office, major civil litigation section; and attorney for a field office of the Legal Services Corporation in Philadelphia. He is a member of the Louisiana, Pennsylvania, District of Columbia and Nebraska bar associations. He is also a member of various federal courts, including the United States Supreme Court. He has taught legal courses at the college level and lectured at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center and other federal training courses.
