John Terzaken is Assistant Chief of the National Criminal Enforcement Section of the Antitrust Division. Mr. Terzaken represents the United States in investigations and prosecutions of corporations and individuals for criminal antitrust violations, including price-fixing and bid rigging, and related offenses. Prior to joining the Antitrust Division, Mr. Terzaken worked as a private practitioner. His practice included a variety of criminal and civil antitrust litigation and counseling.

Mr. Terzaken has written and lectured on legal topics relating to criminal antitrust violations, procurement fraud and the intersection of intellectual property and antitrust laws.

Mr. Terzaken earned his J.D. in 2000 from the University of Virginia School of Law, where he served on the editorial board of the *Virginia Law Review*. He received his B.A., *magna cum laude*, in 1996 from American University.

Mr. Terzaken is admitted to the bars of the Commonwealth of Virginia, District of Columbia, District Court for the District of Columbia, District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals, and Supreme Court.
