
NTSB

- Independent Federal Agency
- 5-Member Board
 - President appointed, Senate confirmed
- 400 Staff
- Investigates accidents in all modes of transportation
- Determines probable cause
- Issues/Implements recommendations



Safety Recommendations

Issued Since 1967 TOTAL = 12,536



How We Pick Accidents

- 8,200 people injured in highway accidents a day
- Approx. 42,000 fatalities per year
- We can only launch on 6 major accidents each year
- 2 teams of 6-8 investigators
- Thorough, comprehensive investigations



How We Pick Accidents

Four basic criteria in evaluating potential highway accidents for investigation.

- 1. Is there high public interest?
- 2. Have we done it before?
- 3. Can we make a difference?
- 4. Do we have the resources?

Actions needed by States

HIGHWAY

Improve Child Occupant Protection

· Enact State laws requiring kooster seats for young children.

Enact Primary Seat Belt Enforcement Laws

- Increase the number of people who wear seat belts through stronger enforcement laws.
 Promote Youth Highway Safety
- Enact graduated driver licensing legislation.
- · Restrict the number of teen passengers traveling with young novice drivers.
- Prohibit use of wireless communications devices by young novice drivers.

Eliminate Hard Core Drinking Driving

- Enact State legislation and take other actions that are proven to reduce crashes involving those who repeatedly drink large amounts of alcohol and drive including:
 - Frequent, statewide solvriety checkpoints.
 Legislation to create stricter sanctions for those arrested the first time with a high
 - blood alcohol concentration of 0.15 or higher.

 Zero blood alcohol requirement for convicted DWI offenders when they get their
 - Administrative rather than court-based license revocation for refusing to take or failing the solariety test
 - · Vehicle sanctions for DWI offenders.
 - Eliminate plea-bargaining DWI offenses and programs that divert offenders and purge the offense record.
 - Retain DWI records for at least 10 years to identify and prosecute repeat offenders.
 - Develop and operate special sanction court-based programs for hard core DWI offenders.

MARINE

Enhance Recreational Boating Safety

- · Require mandatory education of boat operators.
- Require use of life jackets by children.
- Require safety instruction prior to personal watercraft rental.



Medical Oversight

- Establish a comprehensive medical oversight program for interstate commercial drivers
- Ensure that medical examiners are qualified
- Enhance oversight & enforcement of invalid certificates
- Provide mechanisms for reporting medical conditions
- Track all medical certificate applications

Safety Issues

- Operator Fatigue
- Fatigue Technologies and Countermeasures
- Collision Warning Systems



Truck Driver Fatigue

- At most, the truck driver obtained 12.5 hours of sleep in the 2 days before the accident
- Less than 5 hours of sleep in last sleep period
- Was awake for at least 15 hours before the accident
- Sleep was disrupted by alcohol use
- Accident occurred at 1:58 a.m.



On-Board Electronic Recorders

 Require all interstate commercial vehicle carriers to use electronic onboard recorders to collect hours-ofservice data



Motorcoach Braking

- Glen Rock, PA
 - 2-fatality dump truck accident
 - Over ten recommendations issued to FMCSA, CVSA, states, manufacturers, and training organizations

- Recommendations to the CVSA
