Closest Level I Trauma Unit – 190 Miles

- Flagstaff, AZ (2 treated)

26 Treated 75 Miles Away, No Trauma Unit

- Monticello, UT

10 Treated 230 Miles Away, Level II

- Grand Junction, CO

3 Treated 360 Miles Away, Level I

- Salt Lake City, UT

Note: Does Not Include Distances for Emergency Vehicles to Travel to Accident Site



NTSB Role

Independent Accident Investigator

Determine Probable Cause(s)

Look At

- Causes
- Survival Factors
- Emergency Response

Issue Recommendations

Recommendation Acceptance Rate > 80%
