



The enclosed critique was developed from the inspection reports of the inspectors who conducted the seventeenth maintenance inspection of your laboratory under the National Laboratory Certification Program (NLCP). Based upon our review of these reports, the outcome of the laboratory's performance in this inspection is acceptable. Based on documents received from ARUP, it is our understanding that your laboratory ceased specimen testing as of 1 July 1999.
