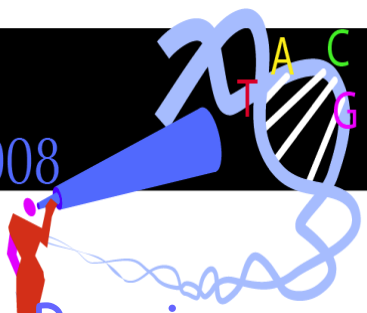

### Resources for DNA Day

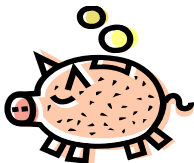
#### University of North Carolina Chapel Hill DNA Day Website

For DNA Day 2007, more than 100 biomedical students from the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill visited North Carolina high schools, replicating the NHGRI model for National DNA Day in an outreach to 67 area schools. The graduate students have created a new website, [http://www.med.unc.edu/pmbb/DNA\\_Day/index.html](http://www.med.unc.edu/pmbb/DNA_Day/index.html), that commemorates DNA Day in addition to providing a portal for North Carolina teachers to request a speaker and DNA Day resources.
