The Federal Interagency Working Group on Environmental Justice (IWG) was established in 1994 under Executive Order (EO) 12898. The IWG is comprised of federal agencies and several White House offices. Chaired by the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the IWG's focus is to integrate environmental justice into federal agency programs, policies and activities. In August 2011 the federal family reaffirmed its commitment to work for environmental justice and continue the collaborative work of the IWG. The IWG works to share lessons-learned and ensure opportunities for collaboration in ensure opportunities for collaboration in addressing environmental justice concerns.

The Environmental Justice Directory will serve as a resource for the public with a goal of increasing communication and collaboration among stakeholders, federal, state, and local agencies, and tribal governments to address environmental justice issues. Most importantly, this Directory will assist community stakeholders with obtaining better access to federal agencies in order to more effectively address environmental justice issues within their local communities.

ORD is the scientific research arm of EPA, whose leading-edge research helps provide the solid underpinning of science and technology for the Agency. The work at ORD laboratories, research centers, and offices across the country helps improve the quality of air, water, soil, and the way we use resources.

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# Office of Solid Waste and Emergency Response

OSWER provides policy, guidance and direction for the Agency's emergency response and waste programs. We develop guidelines for the land disposal of hazardous waste and underground storage tanks. We provide technical assistance to all levels of government to establish safe practices in waste management. We administer the Brownfields program which supports state and local governments in redeveloping and reusing potentially contaminated sites. We also manage the Superfund program, which responds to abandoned and active hazardous waste sites and accidental oil and chemical releases. Finally, we encourage innovative technologies to address contaminated soil and groundwater.
