Director Shown Ohio's Grass Roots During Visit to State Headquarters

Director Lawrence Romo met Ohio's Selective Service family in Columbus.

Director Romo and Region I Director Thomas White first met State Director Ray Orrand accompanied by Norwood Ohio's American Legion Post Commander Kenneth Gillespie and Legionnaire/State Headquarters Detachment Commander Ryan Ruehle. Commander Gillespie traveled from Cincinnati to Columbus to meet the Director and discussed the Board Member Program and Agency participation in the Legion's state and local events. The meeting was an example of the Director's on-going partnership initiative with the American Legion and other veteran's organizations.

He met the next day with State Resource Volunteers (SRV), Board Members and District Appeal Board Members. Hosted by former SHQ Commander LTC (Ret.) Brad Willette, the meeting was held at the Lane Aviation Conference Room at Columbus International Airport, also the site of past "low cost/no cost" Continuation Training and previous Director's meetings. Board Members listened and exchanged ideas and concerns as Director Romo discussed current Agency issues and his vision for the future.

Having volunteered another half day away from their work and families for Selective Service, attendees felt this was a meeting worth having. "We would like to see more of these meetings!" says local business owner and District Appeal Board Chairman Frank Schreck of Westerville. Local Board Member and Franklin University Professor Charles Dygert applauded Director Romo's desire to get their input. After the meeting, LBM James Ryan and DAB Member Fred Kowalski commented it was a good exchange between the Agency's national and region leaders and its grass-roots volunteers in the community.



State Director Orrand chaired the next meeting that day with Ohio's Selective Service Detachment Commanders. During his visit to SSS Ohio State Headquarters, the Director was briefed by Det. Commanders LTC Ryan Ruehle, Major Fred Hunt, and Major Mark McDonald on the "State of the State". Cleveland Detachment Commander Hunt also published and briefed the attendees on a business approach to accomplishing the Selective Service mission and meeting
