that offers you the facts on health care reform. At <a href="HealthCare.gov">HealthCare.gov</a> you can:

- Using the new "Insurance Finder," answer a series of simple questions to compare health insurance plans and view a list of options that work best for you depending on your particular health situation and needs.
- Read a list of the *top five things* you should know about health care access under the new law.
- Learn ways you can improve the quality of your life and prevent illness.
- Compare hospitals, nursing homes and dialysis facilities that best fit your needs.

Whether you are a young adult trying to learn more about extended coverage under your parents' insurance, or a senior looking for more information about how the Affordable Care Act affects your Medicare benefits, you can find answers to questions you may have at <a href="HealthCare.gov">HealthCare.gov</a>.
