Town Hall Meeting - "The Effect of Coverage and Payment on Clinical Research Study Participation and Retention"

Thursday, September 20, 2007 1:00 pm EST to 4:00pm EST in the CMS Multipurpose Room

This announces a Town Hall Meeting. The meeting is being convened to allow interested parties to provide individual advice and recommendations to CMS about the important matters to consider regarding this issue to develop a white paper for dissemination to payers, providers, patients, and researchers. The issue the white paper will address is what the impact of health insurance coverage and payment for items and services in clinical research studies has on the generalizability and validity of study results and findings to guide decision making. This meeting will specifically discuss the following issues: (1) How do payment policies by CMS and other third-party payers affect enrollment into clinical trials? (2) How do payment policies by CMS and other thirdparty payers affect randomization and blinding within clinical trials? (3) What is the summary impact of this effect? (4) Does the timing of third-party payment in the clinical trial process impact the development of better evidence? (5) Do differing payment structures within clinical trials affect the resulting evidence? All interested parties are invited to attend or listen to the Session by teleconference. The session agenda includes an open forum discussion period to permit those in attendance as well as those on the telephone to participate. Written comments will be welcome from everyone. The perspectives expressed during this meeting and in writing will assist the Duke Center for Clinical Health Policy Research in writing the white paper.
