## Winter ResidentialDid You Know...Fire Safety

- Winter residential building fires result in an estimated average of approximately **945 deaths**, **3,825 injuries**, **and \$1.7 billion in property loss** each year.\*
- Winter residential building fires occur mainly in the early evening hours, peaking from **5 to 8 p.m.**\*
- December is the peak time of year for home candle fires. In December, 13 percent of home candle fires begin with decorations compared to 4 percent the rest of the year.\*\*

## **Candle Fire Safety**

By following these candle fire safety tips, everyone can enjoy a safe and happy holiday season:

- If possible, avoid using lighted candles. Flameless candles are a good alternative they look and smell like real candles.
- Use candleholders that are sturdy and won't tip over easily.
- Be sure to extinguish candles after each use.
- Never leave burning candles unattended.
