## Fire Safety

- Winter residential building fires result in an estimated average of approximately 945 deaths, $\mathbf{3 , 8 2 5}$ injuries, and $\$ 1.7$ billion in property loss each year.*
- Winter residential building fires occur mainly in the early evening hours, peaking from 5 to 8 p.m.*
- December is the peak time of year for home candle fires. In December, 13 percent of home candle fires begin with decorations compared to 4 percent the rest of the year.**
