• Technology Discouraged Unauthorized Distribution



- Media not amenable to low cost or high quality reproduction
- Distribution regulated and could be monitored at reasonable cost
  - Broadcast spectrum; Cable

• Unauthorized Distribution Could Be Detected at Reasonable Cost
