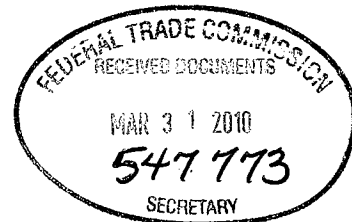


**ORDER GRANTING UNOPPOSED MOTION OF NON-PARTY
MICROSOFT CORPORATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
TO MOVE TO LIMIT OR QUASH SUBPOENA *DUCES TECUM***

On March 30, 2010, non-party Microsoft Corporation (“Microsoft”) submitted an unopposed motion for extension of time to move to limit or quash a Subpoena *Duces Tecum* received from Respondent Intel Corporation (“Intel”) on March 22, 2010 (“Intel Subpoena”).

Microsoft states that it is negotiating with Intel to resolve Microsoft’s concerns regarding the scope of the Intel Subpoena and that additional time is needed to complete those negotiations. Microsoft further states that Intel has agreed that Microsoft may have a thirty-day extension of time to submit a motion to quash or limit the Subpoena. Accordingly, Microsoft seeks an extension of time through May 3, 2010, and further requests that its obligations to otherwise respond to the Intel Subpoena be tolled during the period of the extension.

Based on the foregoing, Microsoft’s Unopposed Motion for Extension of Time to Move to Limit or Quash Subpoena *Duces Tecum* is GRANTED, and it is hereby ORDERED that Microsoft shall have until May 3, 2010 to file a motion to quash or limit the subpoena received from Intel on March 22, 2010, and that Microsoft’s obligations to otherwise respond to such subpoena shall be tolled during the period of the extension.
