ORDER GRANTING SECOND UNOPPOSED MOTION OF NON-PARTY VIA TECHNOLOGIES, INC. FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO MOVE TO LIMIT OR QUASH SUBPOENA *DUCES TECUM*

On April 8, 2010, non-party Via Technologies, Inc. ("Via") submitted a Second Unopposed Motion for Extension of Time to Move to Limit or Quash a Subpoena *Duces Tecum* served on it by Respondent Intel on March 15, 2010 ("Subpoena"). Pursuant to Via's motion of March 29, 2010, Via received an extension of time until April 9, 2010 to move to limit or quash the Subpoena. *See* Order Granting Unopposed Motion of Non-Party Via Technologies, Inc. for Extension of Time to Move to Limit or Quash Subpoena *Duces Tecum*, March 30, 2010.

Via states that it is still negotiating with Intel to resolve Via's concerns regarding the Subpoena, and that on April 7, 2010, Intel provided Via with a revised list of document categories for production. Via states that Intel has agreed to a second extension of time for Via to move to limit or quash the Subpoena until April 19, 2010, so that the parties may continue their negotiations and allow for the potential resolution of the discovery issues without litigation. Accordingly, Via requests a second extension of time to move to limit or quash the Subpoena until April 19, 2010, without prejudice to seek a further extension. Via states that Intel and Complaint Counsel do not oppose the requested extension.

Based on the foregoing, Via's Second Unopposed Motion for Extension of Time is GRANTED, and it is hereby ORDERED that Via shall have until April 19, 2010 to move to limit or quash the subpoena served upon Via by Intel on March 15, 2010.
