MICROSOFT CORPORATION'S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE MOTION TO LIMIT OR QUASH SUBPOENAS *DUCES TECUM*

Non-party Microsoft Corporation ("Microsoft") files this unopposed Motion for Extension of Time to File Motion to Limit or Quash Subpoenas *Duces Tecum* received by Microsoft's agent for service of process from Intel Corporation ("Intel") on March 22, 2010 ("Intel's Subpoena"), Complaint Counsel on April 7, 2010 ("Complaint Counsel's April 7 Subpoena"), and Complaint Counsel on April 26, 2010 ("Complaint Counsel's April 26 Subpoena," collectively "Subpoenas").

Microsoft previously received extensions of time until May 3, 2010 to move to limit or quash Intel's Subpoena and Complaint Counsel's April 7 Subpoena in order for negotiations regarding the scope and burden of these subpoenas to continue effectively.¹ Pursuant to the FTC's Rules of Practice, 16 C.F.R. § 3.34(c), Microsoft has ten (10) days in which to file a motion to limit or quash Complaint Counsel's April 26 Subpoena, or until May 6, 2010.

Microsoft has made an initial production and has continued to work diligently with Intel's Counsel and Complaint Counsel to discuss the scope and burden of the Subpoenas and propose various modifications to the Subpoenas. Microsoft's Counsel, Intel's Counsel, and Complaint Counsel have agreed that Microsoft shall have until May 17, 2010 to file a motion to limit or quash the Subpoenas. The additional extension is necessary to complete negotiations among Microsoft's Counsel, Intel's Counsel, and Complaint Counsel effectively and to allow Microsoft to provide additional information in response to the Subpoenas.

Accordingly, Microsoft respectfully requests that this unopposed motion be granted and that Microsoft have until May 17, 2010 to file a motion to limit or quash the Subpoenas.² Further, during such time, Microsoft's obligations to otherwise respond to the Subpoenas shall be tolled, although Microsoft anticipates that it will continue negotiations as well as rolling productions of documents in the interim.

Undersigned counsel represents that they have conferred with both Intel's Counsel and Complaint Counsel and that both Intel's Counsel and Complaint Counsel do not object to the proposed extension.

[PROPOSED] ORDER GRANTING NON-PARTY MICROSOFT CORPORATION'S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE MOTION TO LIMIT OR QUASH SUBPOENAS DUCES TECUM

On April 30, 2010, non-party Microsoft Corporation ("Microsoft") submitted an unopposed motion for extension of time to move to limit or quash Subpoenas *Duces Tecum* received from Intel Corporation ("Intel") on March 22, 2010, Complaint Counsel on April 7, 2010, and Complaint Counsel on April 26, 2010 (collectively "Subpoenas"). Microsoft requests an extension until May 17, 2010 and further requests that Microsoft's obligations to otherwise respond to the Subpoenas be tolled during the period of extension. Microsoft states that both Intel's Counsel and Complaint Counsel do not oppose the motion.

Microsoft states that it is negotiating with Intel's Counsel and Complaint Counsel to resolve issues regarding the scope of the Subpoenas and that additional time is needed to complete those negotiations. Microsoft further states that it is working to respond to the Subpoenas, has made an initial production of documents, and anticipates continuing its productions on a rolling basis. According to Microsoft, Intel's Counsel and Complaint Counsel agree that Microsoft may have an extension of time to move to limit or quash the Subpoenas until May 17, 2010.

Based on the foregoing, Microsoft's Unopposed Motion for Extension of Time to File Motion to Limit or Quash Subpoenas *Duces Tecum* is GRANTED, and it is hereby ORDERED that Microsoft shall have until May 17, 2010 to file a motion to limit or quash the subpoenas received from Intel Corporation on March 22, 2010, Complaint Counsel on April 7, 2010, and Complaint Counsel on April 26, 2010, and that Microsoft's obligations to otherwise respond to such subpoenas shall be tolled during the period of the extension.
