Members discussed the status of the consulting services acquired to assist the Board in establishing a strong governance foundation. The Chairman informed the members that in conjunction with the Office of Management and Budget and the National Academy of Public Administration a week-long national web-based "town hall" to get innovative ideas from the public to integrate, track, and display data from thousands of federal, state, and local entities would be held the week of April 27, 2009.
