
Hands-On Science

Discover the wonder in your own backyard! The Backyard Discoveries program educates the public about ecosystem science through hands-on experiences and volunteer opportunities. The process of science is presented through natural collection efforts (an herbarium and an insect collection), environmental monitoring opportunities (bird banding, stream bioassessments, an annual butterfly count, and weed counts), and education outreach programs (the Fireside Chat lecture series, the Astronomy series, the Midsummer Night's Science series, May Bird Walks, and adult education classes).



Year-Round Recreation

The BLM Campbell Tract serves as a forested recreation site for urban Anchorage with nearly 12 miles of trails. These multi-use trails offer year-round non-motorized recreation opportunities, including hiking, jogging, skiing and skijoring, snowshoeing, mountain biking, and horseback riding. The area's diverse plants, wildlife, and habitats also serve as a wonderful outdoor classroom for the Anchorage community.




Special Events


