The Securities and Exchange Commission's (Commission) May 8, 2008, Order Instituting Proceedings (OIP) in this matter charged that American Motorcycle Corp. (American Motorcycle) had violated Section 13(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 13a-1 and 13a-13 thereunder by repeatedly failing to file required periodic reports. American Motorcycle failed to file an Answer within ten days of the May 15, 2008, service of the OIP, and the registration of its registered securities was revoked, by default, pursuant to 17 C.F.R. § 155(a)(2). Am. Kiosk Corp., Exchange Act Release No. 57886 (A.L.J. May 30, 2008) (Default Order). American Motorcycle filed a motion to set aside the Default Order, and the undersigned afforded it an opportunity to pursue setting aside the default. Am. Kiosk Corp., (A.L.J. June 2, 2008) (unpublished); Am. Kiosk Corp., (A.L.J. June 20, 2008) (unpublished).

At a June 27, 2008, telephone conference, the parties advised that American Motorcycle had submitted an executed Offer of Settlement consenting to a revocation of the registration of its securities and requested that the default be set aside to permit the Division of Enforcement to present the Offer of Settlement to the Commission for its consideration. Accordingly, pursuant to 17 C.F.R. § 201.155(b), the default as to American Motorcycle will be set aside.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
