## Talks

### Critter Chat

Get to know some creatures that live in the most diverse ecosystem in California. Meet near the flagpole at the Foothills Visitor Center to learn more. 20 minutes.

### Park Orientation

### Pulse of the Planet

Seasonally dependent black bear, pika, and California buckeye survive and thrive when the time is right. Just like you don't wear your bathing suit in winter, discover why timing is essential in nature. Meet at the Foothills Visitor Center. 45 minutes.

## Activities

### River Rendezvous

Ever wonder what little creatures make their home in the beautiful Kaweah River? Join a ranger and discover their underwater world and why they're here. Follow the trail down to the river across the street from Potwisha Campground.

### Investigation Station

What can an animal's teeth tell us? What does a wild cucumber look like? Come investigate and discover the many stories the Foothills have to share. Drop in at the Foothills Visitor Center to learn more about life in the park.

### People, Places, & the Past

Discover Hospital Rock! Step back in time and learn more about the people who called this area home. Meet near the bear box in the Hospital Rock Picnic Area. 30 minutes.

### Lovin' the River Life

Let the river come alive as you learn what animals live there and what it takes for them to survive. Walk ¼ mile to the bridge on the Paradise Creek trail beginning in Buckeye Flat Campground near site #28. Parking is available at Hospital Rock.

### Twilight Walk

As twilight settles over the park, join a ranger along the Kaweah River to hear how its power, and strength shaped the landscape and influenced humans throughout time. Meet at the Paradise Creek Trailhead in Buckeye Flat Campground across from site #28. 1 hour. Park at Hospital Rock.
