Program Descriptions

Big Tree Talk: Meet a ranger at the base of the General Grant Tree to learn what it takes to be one of the largest trees on Earth. *15 minutes*.

Buena Vista Peak Hike: An inspiring view awaits you at the end of this moderate hike. Meet at the visitor center to caravan to the Buena Vista trailhead, 7 miles south of Grant Grove. *3 hours, 2 miles*.

Evening Program: Join a ranger at the Sunset Amphitheater for a talk, slide show, or film about the people, places and things that make Kings Canyon National Park so special. *1 hour*.

Grant Tree Walk: Learn about the giant sequoias and why people have been coming to Grant Grove for centuries. Meet in the Grant Tree parking lot for this easy walk through the grove. *1 hour*, ½*-mile walk*.

Kids' Campfire: Ready to receive your Junior Ranger badge? Want to learn how to earn one? Join us at Sunset Amphitheater for a special Junior Ranger awards ceremony and a variety of songs, stories, or games designed especially for kids. Please come 15 minutes early if you plan to turn in a Junior Ranger booklet. ½ hour.

Meadow Meander: Yes, the trees are the most famous inhabitants of these parks, but the places where the trees don't grow are also important. Find out why in this easy stroll around one of our local meadows. Meet in front of the Visitor Center. *1 hour, ¹/₂ mile walk*.

Nature's Greatest Mountaineers: The Sierra Nevada Bighorn Sheep live on the edge in more ways than one. Meet at the Visitor Center to learn about the life of these endangered inhabitants of Kings Canyon and the on-going efforts to increase their numbers. *30 minutes.*

Night Sky on Park Ridge: Want to know more about the constellations overhead? Join us for a late night of naked-eye stargazing. Sign up early for this popular program. Maximum of 25 participants, ages 5 and up. To reserve your spot, visit or phone the Kings Canyon Visitor Center at 559-565-4307. *1 ½ hours, 5 mile drive, ½ mile hike*.

Owls - Masters of the Night: Wherever you go in Sequoia and Kings Canyon, you are probably in the home of an owl. Meet at the visitor center to learn why owls are so successful. ¹/₂ hour.

Ranger in the Grove: How big? How old? What happens in a fire? Look for a ranger along the Grant Tree Trail to have all your sequoia questions answered. *ongoing*.
