




Too Many Voices

How MixedInk Works





An agency sets up project & time frame and invites public to participate



Citizens write original versions of the text and remix language & ideas to make new versions



People rate versions on a 5-star scale, bubbling the best ideas to the top



The highest-rated text can be incorporated into policy decisions

Agency: White House Office of Science & Technology Policy

Text: Recommendations on making the government more transparent, collaborative, and participatory

Policy impact: Language & ideas to be incorporated into Open Government Directive

Open Government Directive, Phase Three: Drafting



President Obama issued a Memorandum on Transparency and Open Government in which he called for recommendations on making the government more transparent, participatory, and collaborative.

The White House Open Government Initiative is crafting these recommendations in an open fashion with your input. An initial Brainstorming phase in late May asked you to identify topics for the recommendations. The Discussion phase in early June explored those topics in greater depth.

Today, we ask you to work together through July 6th to draft recommendations that translate good ideas and lofty principles into specific actions that can be taken to achieve open government.

Here is what we are asking you to do:

- 1. Watch the video explaining how to use MixedInk.
- 2. Choose a topic.
- Rate different versions to help choose the best set of recommendations for a given topic, now that the submission period has ended.

How to use MixedInk

Recommendations should be concise and address:

Ark Francisco

Who? - Who is being directed to do what? What? - What is the recommendation designed to achieve?

Why? - Why is it important?

How? - How will success be measured?

Each topic can include several recommendations. These recommendations will inform the drafting of an "Open Government Directive" to Executive branch

Other Use Cases



Ask citizens to write:

- Arguments for & against a policy option under consideration (restart cash-for-clunkers)
- Draft policy language at the start of the rulemaking process (net neutrality)
- A collective comment on a rule already drafted internally (executive compensation)
- Key principles that should form the basis for new policies (passenger bill of rights)

Also, consider limiting participation to government employees or trusted experts.

Avoiding Spam & Abuse



- Community moderation
 - Report inappropriate content
 - Rate weaker submissions down
- Organizer moderation
 - Remove inappropriate content completely
 - Move off-topic content to a separate, public page
- Automatic controls
 - Curse word filter
 - Algorithm limits effect of abusive behavior
 - No direct links to submissions

Wikis & MixedInk



Use a Wiki for:

- Knowledge management
- Many linked pages
- Small teams
- Longer documents
- Uncontroversial subjects
- Compiling minor edits

Use MixedInk for:

- Many participants
- Short time frames
- Short texts
- Avoiding abuse
- Avoiding edit wars
- Capturing consensus democratically

Helpful Tips



- Pick an approachable, engaging topic.
- Aim for final texts of ~1000 words or less. Divide longer texts up into sections.
- Make clear how project will tie into policy.
- Interact with participants throughout the process.
- Seed the project with sample texts.
- Promote link prominently and repeatedly on your website, via press, email, FaceBook/MySpace, Twitter, etc.
- Partner with outside groups for outreach.
