## Labor Force Characteristics by Race and Ethnicity, 2011

## Overview

In 2011, the unemployment rate for the United States averaged 8.9 percent, but varied across race and ethnicity groups. The rates were highest for Blacks (15.8 percent) and for American Indians and Alaska Natives (14.6 percent) and lowest for Whites ( 7.9 percent) and for Asians ( 7.0 percent). The jobless rate was 13.6 percent for persons of two or more races, 11.5 percent for Hispanics, and 10.4 percent for Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders.

Differences in labor force characteristics emerge when the race and ethnicity groups are compared. These differences reflect a variety of factors, not all of which are measurable. These factors include variations across the groups in educational attainment; the occupations and industries in which the groups work; the geographic areas of the country in which the groups are concentrated, including whether they tend to reside in urban or rural settings; and the degree of discrimination encountered in the workplace.

This report describes the labor force characteristics and earnings patterns among the major race and ethnicity groups-Whites, Blacks, Asians, and Hispanics-and provides more detailed data through a set of supporting tables. These data are obtained from the Current Population Survey (CPS), a monthly survey of 60,000 households that is a rich source of information on the labor force. For the first time, this report also includes a limited amount of data for American Indians, Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians, Other Pacific Islanders, and for people who are of two or more races. Due to their relatively small sample size, estimates for these additional groups are not included in all tables. The following bullets highlight some of the major findings on the labor force characteristics of race and ethnicity groups in 2011.

## Composition of the labor force

- By race, Whites made up the majority of the labor force in 2011 ( 81 percent). Blacks and Asians made up an additional 12 percent and 5 percent, respectively. American Indians and Alaska Natives composed about 1 percent of the labor force, as did persons of two or more races. Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders made up less than 1 percent. (See table 1.)
- By ethnicity, 15 percent of the labor force in 2011 were Hispanic or Latino. The majority of Hispanics
in the labor force were Mexican (63 percent). The remainder consisted of Central and South Americans (25 percent), Puerto Ricans (8 percent), and Cubans (4 percent). (See table 2.)
- People of Hispanic ethnicity may be of any race. In 2011, the majority of Hispanics (93 percent) were White, 3 percent were Black, and 1 percent were Asian.


## Labor force participation

- In 2011, American Indians and Alaska Natives (59.2 percent) and Blacks (61.4 percent) had the lowest labor force participation rates among the race and ethnicity groups, while Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders ( 69.4 percent) had the highest participation rates. The participation rates for Hispanics, Asians, and Whites, were 66.5 percent, 64.6 percent, and 64.5 percent, respectively. The participation rate for persons of two or more races was 64.0 percent in 2011. (See tables 1, 2, 3, and 4.)
- Among adult men (age 20 and over) in the major race and ethnicity groups, Blacks (68.4 percent) were less likely than other race and ethnicity groups to participate in the labor force. Hispanic men (81.7 percent) were more likely to participate in the labor force than other men. The labor force participation rate was 76.6 percent for Asian men and 73.9 percent for White men. (See table 3.)
- Among adult women, the proportions of White women (59.4 percent), Hispanic women ( 59.0 percent), and Asian women ( 58.7 percent) in the labor force were lower than that of Black women (62.2 percent).


## Employment

- In 2011, the employment-population ratio (that is, the proportion of the population that is employed) ranged from 50.5 percent for American Indians and Alaska Natives to 62.2 percent for Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders. The employmentpopulation ratio was 51.7 percent for Blacks, 55.3 percent for individuals of two or more races, 58.9 percent for Hispanics, 59.4 percent for Whites, and 60.0 percent for Asians. (See tables 1, 2, 3, and 5.)
- Among adult men (age 20 and older), Hispanics (73.3 percent) continued to have the highest
employment-population ratio in 2011, followed by Asians (71.7 percent) and Whites ( 68.2 percent). The employment-population ratio for Black men, at 56.9 percent, was lower than the ratios for men in other groups in 2011, continuing a long-term pattern. Among adult women, Whites had the highest employment-population ratio, at 55.3 percent, followed by Asians (54.6 percent), and Blacks (54.0 percent). The ratio for Hispanic women (52.5 percent) continued to be lower than the ratio for other groups. (See table 3.)
- Among teenagers ages 16 to 19 , the employmentpopulation ratio was higher for Whites than for Hispanics, Asians, or Blacks. In 2011, the ratio for White teens (28.8 percent) was nearly twice that for Black teens (14.7 percent). The ratios for Hispanic and Asian teens were 19.5 percent and 16.2 percent, respectively.


## Education

- Among people age 25 and older, the share of the labor force with at least a high school diploma was about 90 percent for Whites, Blacks, and Asians in 2011. By contrast, 69 percent of Hispanics in the labor force had completed high school. Asians were the most likely of the groups to have graduated from college; 57 percent of Asians in the labor force had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared with 36 percent of Whites, 25 percent of Blacks, and 16 percent of Hispanics. (See table 6.)
- For all major race and ethnicity groups, higher levels of education are generally associated with a greater likelihood of employment and a lower likelihood of unemployment. Individuals with higher levels of education generally have better access to higher paying jobs-such as those in management, professional, and related occupations-than do individuals with less education. However, at nearly every level of education, Blacks and Hispanics were more likely to be unemployed in 2011 than were Whites or Asians.


## Occupation and industry

- The highest paying major occupational category is management, professional, and related occupations. In 2011, 47 percent of employed Asians worked in this occupational group, compared with 38 percent of employed Whites, 29 percent of employed Blacks, and 20 percent of employed Hispanics. (See table 7.)
- Among employed men, nearly half (49 percent) of Asians worked in management, professional, and
related occupations in 2011, compared with 35 percent of Whites, 24 percent of Blacks, and 16 percent of Hispanics. About 2 in 10 employed Black and Hispanic men were employed in service occupations in 2011, whereas about 1 in 10 employed Asian and White men worked in these occupations. Employed Black and Hispanic men also were more likely than White or Asian men to work in production, transportation, and material moving occupations. About one-quarter of employed Hispanic men (26 percent) worked in natural resources, construction, and maintenance occupations, a higher share than for White men (18 percent), Black men (12 percent), or Asian men ( 7 percent).
- In 2011, employed Asian and White women were more likely than other women to work in management, professional, and related occupations-44 percent of Asian women and 42 percent of White women. By contrast, 34 percent of employed Black women and 25 percent of employed Hispanic women worked in this occupational group. Among employed women, 63 percent of Hispanics worked in either service occupations or sales and office occupations, compared with about 59 percent of Blacks, 52 percent of Whites, and 48 percent of Asians.
- In 2011, Hispanics accounted for 15 percent of total employment but were overrepresented by a substantial amount in several occupational categories, including miscellaneous agricultural workers (50 percent), roofers (47 percent), and packers and packagers (46 percent). Blacks made up 11 percent of all employed workers, but accounted for about one-quarter or more of those in several specific occupations, including nursing, psychiatric, and home health aides ( 33 percent); security guards (27 percent); and taxi drivers (27 percent). Asians accounted for 5 percent of all employed workers but made up a much larger share of workers in several occupational categories, including miscellaneous personal appearance workers (makeup artists, manicurists and pedicurists, shampooers, and skin care specialists; 55 percent), software developers (27 percent), and physicians and surgeons (16 percent). Whites made up 82 percent of all employed persons, but accounted for 96 percent of farmers, ranchers, and other agricultural managers; 95 percent of firefighters; and 94 percent of construction managers. (See table 8.)
- By industry, 18 percent of employed Hispanic men worked in construction in 2011, a larger share than White (12 percent), Black (7 percent), or Asian men (3 percent). Twelve percent of employed Black men worked in transportation and utilities, compared with 7 percent each of Hispanic and White men and

6 percent of Asian men. About 17 percent of employed Asian men worked in professional and business services, higher than the shares of their White (13 percent), Hispanic (12 percent), and Black (11 percent) counterparts. A large share of women in all race and ethnicity groups worked in education and health services in 2011-Blacks (42 percent), Whites (36 percent), Asians (31 percent), and Hispanics (30 percent). (See table 9.)

## Families and mothers

- In 2011, 88 percent of Asian families had an employed family member, compared with 84 percent of Hispanic families and 80 percent of White families. Black families remained the least likely to have an employed family member ( 74 percent). (See table 10.)
- In 2011, nearly one-half (45 percent) of Black families and one-fourth ( 25 percent) of Hispanic families were maintained by women without a spouse present. About 16 percent of White families and 12 percent of Asian families were maintained by women. Among families maintained by women with no spouse present, Asian families were most likely to have an employed family member (81 percent), while Black families were the least likely to have an employed family member (67 percent). The proportion of White and Hispanic families that were maintained by women with an employed family member was 74 and 72 percent, respectively. In general, families maintained by women without a spouse present are less likely to have an employed member than other families.
- Among mothers with children under 18, Blacks were more likely to be in the labor force than Whites, Asians, or Hispanics. In 2011, 75.3 percent of Black mothers were labor force participants, compared with 70.2 percent of White mothers, 65.4 percent of Asian mothers, and 61.8 percent of Hispanic mothers. (See table 11.)


## Unemployment and not in the labor force

- In 2011, unemployment rates among the race and ethnicity groups varied considerably by race and ethnicity. Blacks (15.8 percent) and American Indians and Alaska Natives (14.6 percent) had the highest unemployment rates, while Asians (7.0 percent) and Whites (7.9 percent) had the lowest. The unemployment rate was 11.5 percent for Hispanics, 10.4 percent for Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific

Islanders, and 13.6 percent for individuals of two or more races. (See tables 1, 2, 3, and 12.)

- Among the major race and ethnicity groups, the jobless rates in 2011 for Black adult men and women (age 20 and older) were 16.7 and 13.2 percent, respectively. The unemployment rate for Hispanic adult men was 10.3 percent, and the rate for Hispanic adult women was 11.1 percent. In comparison, the unemployment rate for White adult men was 7.7 percent, and the rate for White adult women was 7.0 percent. The jobless rates for Asian adult men and women were 6.4 and 7.0 percent, respectively. (See table 3.)
- Black teenagers had the highest unemployment rate among the major race and ethnicity groups-41.3 percent in 2011. The unemployment rates for Hispanic, Asian, and White teenagers were 31.1 percent, 25.2 percent, and 21.7 percent, respectively.
- Unemployed Asians and Blacks experienced longer periods of unemployment than other workers. In 2011, the median duration of unemployment for Asians and Blacks was 27.7 weeks and 27.0 weeks, respectively, compared with 19.7 weeks for Whites and 18.5 weeks for Hispanics. (See table 13.)
- Of the 13.7 million unemployed persons in 2011, 59 percent ( 8.1 million) were job losers (that is, those workers who lost their jobs and those who completed temporary jobs). Reentrants to the labor force (25 percent), job leavers (7 percent), and new entrants (9 percent) constituted the balance of unemployed persons. Of the total unemployed for each major race and ethnicity group, about 60 percent of Whites and Hispanics were job losers in 2011, compared with 55 percent of Blacks and 53 percent of Asians. About 13 percent of Asians and 11 percent of Blacks and Hispanics were new entrants to the labor force in 2011, compared with nearly 9 percent of Whites. (See table 14.)
- In 2011, Blacks made up 12 percent of the civilian labor force, but 23 percent of persons marginally attached to the labor force. Persons marginally attached to the labor force are individuals who were not in the labor force, wanted and were available for work, and had looked for a job sometime in the previous 12 months-but not in the 4 weeks preceding the survey. Hispanics and Asians were represented among the marginally attached nearly proportionately to their shares of the labor force. Whites were underrepresented among the marginally attached
relative to their share of the labor force. Blacks also composed a high proportion of discouraged workers (about 26 percent) in 2011. Discouraged workers, a subset of the marginally attached, are persons not currently looking for work because they believe no jobs are available for them. (See table 15.)


## Earnings

- Among the major race and ethnicity groups, Hispanics and Blacks had considerably lower earnings than Asians and Whites. In 2011, the median usual weekly earnings of full-time wage and salary workers were \$549 for Hispanics, \$615 for Blacks, \$775 for Whites, and $\$ 866$ for Asians. Among men, the earnings of Whites (\$856), Blacks (\$653), and Hispanics (\$571) were 88 percent, 67 percent, and 59 percent, respectively, of the earnings of Asians (\$970). The median earnings of White women (\$703), Black women (\$595), and Hispanic women (\$518) were 94, 79, and 69 percent, respectively, of the earnings of Asian women (\$751). (See table 16.)
- For men, the earnings disparity across the major race and ethnicity groups holds for nearly all major occupational groups. For example, in 2011, median usual weekly earnings of Asian men $(\$ 1,414)$ and White men $(\$ 1,294)$ working full time in manage-
ment, professional, and related occupations (the highest paying major occupation group) were well above the earnings of Hispanic men $(\$ 1,019)$ and Black men (\$965) in the same occupation group. Among those employed in management, professional, and related occupations, the earnings ratios of White, Hispanic, and Black men to Asian men were 92 percent, 72 percent, and 68 percent, respectively. In contrast, the earnings of White men employed full time in production, transportation, and material moving occupations were higher (\$667) than the earnings of Black, Asian, and Hispanic men (\$595, \$584, and \$525, respectively).
- Among the race and ethnicity groups, the earnings disparity was similar for women to that for men across the major occupational groups. For example, in production, transportation, and material moving occupations, the weekly earnings of White (\$486) and Black (\$490) women were about the same in 2011; the earnings of Asian and Hispanic women were $\$ 461$ and $\$ 405$ per week, respectively. In management, professional, and related occupations, the earnings of Asian women were higher than women of other race and ethnicity groups. In 2011, the earnings of White, Black, and Hispanic women were 84 percent, 74 percent, and 73 percent, respectively, of the earnings of Asian women.

## Technical note

The estimates in this report were obtained from the Current Population Survey (CPS), a national monthly sample survey of approximately 60,000 eligible households that provides a wide range of information on the labor force, employment, and unemployment. Earnings data are collected from onefourth of the CPS monthly sample. The survey is conducted for the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) by the U.S. Census Bureau, using a scientifically selected national sample with coverage in all 50 states and the District of Columbia.

## Concepts and definitions

Civilian noninstitutional population. Included are persons 16 years of age and older residing in the 50 states and the District of Columbia who are not confined to institutions, such as nursing homes and prisons, and who are not on active duty in the Armed Forces.

Employed persons. All persons who, during the reference week, (a) did any work at all (at least 1 hour) as paid employees; worked in their own business, profession, or on their own farm; or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in an enterprise operated by a member of the family; and (b) all those who were not working but who had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent because of vacation, illness, bad weather, childcare problems, maternity or paternity leave, labor-management dispute, job training, or other family or personal reasons, whether or not they were paid for the time off or were seeking other jobs.

Unemployed persons. All persons who had no employment during the reference week, were available for work (except for temporary illness), and had made specific efforts to find employment sometime during the 4-week period ending with the reference week. Persons who were waiting to be recalled to a job from which they had been laid off need not have been looking for work to be classified as unemployed.

Duration of unemployment. This represents the length of time (through the reference week) that persons classified as unemployed had been looking for work. For persons on layoff, duration of unemployment represents the number of full weeks they had been on layoff. Mean duration is the arithme-
tic average computed from single weeks of unemployment; median duration is the midpoint of a distribution of weeks of unemployment.

Reason for unemployment. Unemployment also is categorized according to the status of individuals at the time they began to look for work. The reasons for unemployment are divided into four major groups:
(1) Job losers, comprising (a) persons on temporary layoff, who have been given a date to return to work or who expect to return within 6 months (persons on layoff need not be looking for work to qualify as unemployed), (b) permanent job losers, whose employment ended involuntarily and who began looking for work, and (c) persons who completed temporary jobs, who began looking for work after the jobs ended.
(2) Job leavers, persons who quit or otherwise terminated their employment voluntarily and immediately began looking for work.
(3) Reentrants, persons who previously worked but who were out of the labor force prior to beginning their job search.
(4) New entrants, persons who had never worked.

Labor force. This group comprises all persons classified as employed or unemployed in accordance with the criteria described above.

Unemployment rate. This represents the number of unemployed persons as a percentage of the labor force.

Participation rate. This represents the proportion of the population that is in the labor force.

Employment-population ratio. This represents the proportion of the population that is employed.

Not in the labor force. Included in this group are all persons in the civilian noninstitutional population who are neither employed nor unemployed. Persons marginally attached to the labor force are those individuals who are not in the labor force who wanted and were available for work and had looked for a job sometime in the prior 12 months (or since
the end of their last job if they held one within the past 12 months). They were not counted as unemployed because they had not searched for work in the 4 weeks preceding the survey. Discouraged workers, a subset of the marginally attached, were not looking for work because they believed no jobs were available for them.

Occupation and industry. This information applies to the job held during the reference week. People with two or more jobs are classified in the occupation and industry in which they worked the greatest number of hours. The occupational and industry classification of CPS data is based on the 2010 Census Occupational Classification system and the 2007 Census Industrial Classification system, which are derived from the 2010 Standard Occupation Classification (SOC) and the 2007 North American Industry Classification (NAICS). White, Black or African American, Asian, American Indian and Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander. In accordance with the Office of Management and Budget guidelines, these are terms used to describe the race of persons. Beginning in 2003, persons in these categories are those who selected that race group only. Those who identify multiple race groups are categorized as persons of two or more races. (Previously, persons identified a group as their main race.) Estimates for Asians, American Indians and Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders, and persons of two or more races are not shown separately in all tables because the number of survey respondents is too small to develop estimates of sufficient quality. In the enumeration process, race is determined by the household respondent. Hispanic or Latino ethnicity. This refers to persons who identified themselves in the enumeration process as being Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino. Persons whose ethnicity is identified as Hispanic or Latino may be of any race. More information on the 2003 changes in questions on race and Hispanic ethnicity is available at http://www.bls.gov/cps/rvcps03.pdf.

Usual weekly earnings. Data represent earnings before taxes and other deductions, and include any overtime pay, commissions, or tips usually received (at the main job, in the case of multiple jobholders). Earnings reported on a basis other than weekly (for example, annual, monthly, hourly) are converted
to weekly. The term "usual" is as perceived by the respondent. If the respondent asks for a definition of usual, interviewers are instructed to define the term as more than half the weeks worked during the past 4 or 5 months. Data refer to the sole or primary job of wage and salary workers (excluding all self-employed persons regardless of whether their businesses were incorporated).

Median earnings. These figures indicate the value that divides the earnings distribution into two equal parts, one part having values above the median and the other having values below the median. The medians shown in this publication are calculated by linear interpolation of the $\$ 50$ centered interval within which each median falls.

Family. A family is defined as a group of two or more persons residing together who are related by birth, marriage, or adoption; all such persons are considered as members of one family. Families are classified either as married-couple families or as families maintained by women or men without spouses.

Children. Data on children refer to one's own children and include sons, daughters, stepchildren, and adopted children. Not included are nieces, nephews, grandchildren, other related children, and all unrelated children living in the household.

## Reliability of the estimates

Statistics based on the CPS are subject to both sampling and nonsampling error. When a sample, rather than an entire population, is surveyed, there is a chance that the sample estimates may differ from the "true" population values they represent. The exact difference, or sampling error, varies depending on the particular sample selected, and this variability is measured by the standard error of the estimate. There is about a 90 - percent chance, or level of confidence, that an estimate based on a sample will differ by no more than 1.6 standard errors from the "true" population value because of sampling error. BLS analyses are generally conducted at the 90- percent level of confidence.

All other types of error are referred to as nonsampling error. Nonsampling error can occur for many reasons, including the failure to sample a segment of the population, inability to obtain information for all respondents in the sample, inability or unwillingness of respondents to provide correct information, and errors made in the collection or processing of data.
