Were you offered less information than another applicant(s)?
Did the landlord deny you the opportunity to make modifications because of your disability?
Are families with children or persons with disabilities limited to only certain buildings in the apartment complex or development?

Did you have difficulty purchasing homeowners insurance due to the location of your neighborhood?
Were you referred to a particular insurance company because of your credit history?

Were you assured that you did not need to get an inspection?
Were you referred to a particular lender because of your credit history?
