Policy of IGRA

Sec. 2702. Declaration of policy

The purpose of this chapter is -

 (1) to provide a statutory basis for the operation of gaming by Indian tribes as a means of promoting tribal economic development, self-sufficiency, and strong tribal governments;

 - Summer 2010 Consultation
- Department of Interior Tribal Consultation Team (DOI TCT)

- Sister agencies

Agency Operations Review

- Budget
 - Funded primarily by tribal fee assessments. Agency must be good stewards of these fees
- Internal Policies & Procedures
 - Top to bottom review
- Indian Preference
 - Primary mission of Agency benefits tribes
- Strategic Plan
 - GPRA compliance
- Operations
 - Streamline, Human Capital Assessment, DC HQ Move, Website

Notice of Inquiry (NOI) - What is it?

- Method to engage with stakeholders
 - Ask questions
 - Solicit input
 - Prior to initiating Rulemaking Process
- Published in the Federal Register
- EO 13175 Sec. 3

- November 18, 2010 Publication
 - 86 Day Comment Period
 - Comment Deadline February 12, 2011
- Agency's Assessment of Regulations
 - Changes NIGC identified that would further assist our responsibilities
- Questions to Tribes:
 - WHICH regulations need to be addressed?
 - In what order (PRIORITY)?
 - How should we do this (PROCESS)?

- Cast a wide outreach net
- Posted on Website
 - Link to NOI & Regs
 - Link to submit comments on-line
- Consultations
 - 8 cities in January & February 2011

- Compile & review all comments
- Create & publish a priority list, timetable & transparent process
- Then the FUN begins....
 - Engage in the process
 - Limited time to accomplish priority regulations
 - EO 13175 Sec. 3, Policy Making Criteria
