
Work-related fatality rates are higher for older workers. In 2006, workers 45 years and older recorded fatality rates higher than the all-worker rate, while workers 44 years and younger recorded fatality rates lower than the all-worker rate. The fatality rate for workers 65 years

and older (11.2 fatal work injuries per 100,000 workers) was nearly 3 times higher than the all-worker rate of 4.0.

Meanwhile, the fatality rate for workers 16 and 17 years old (0.9 fatalities per 100,000 workers) was considerably less than the all-worker rate.
