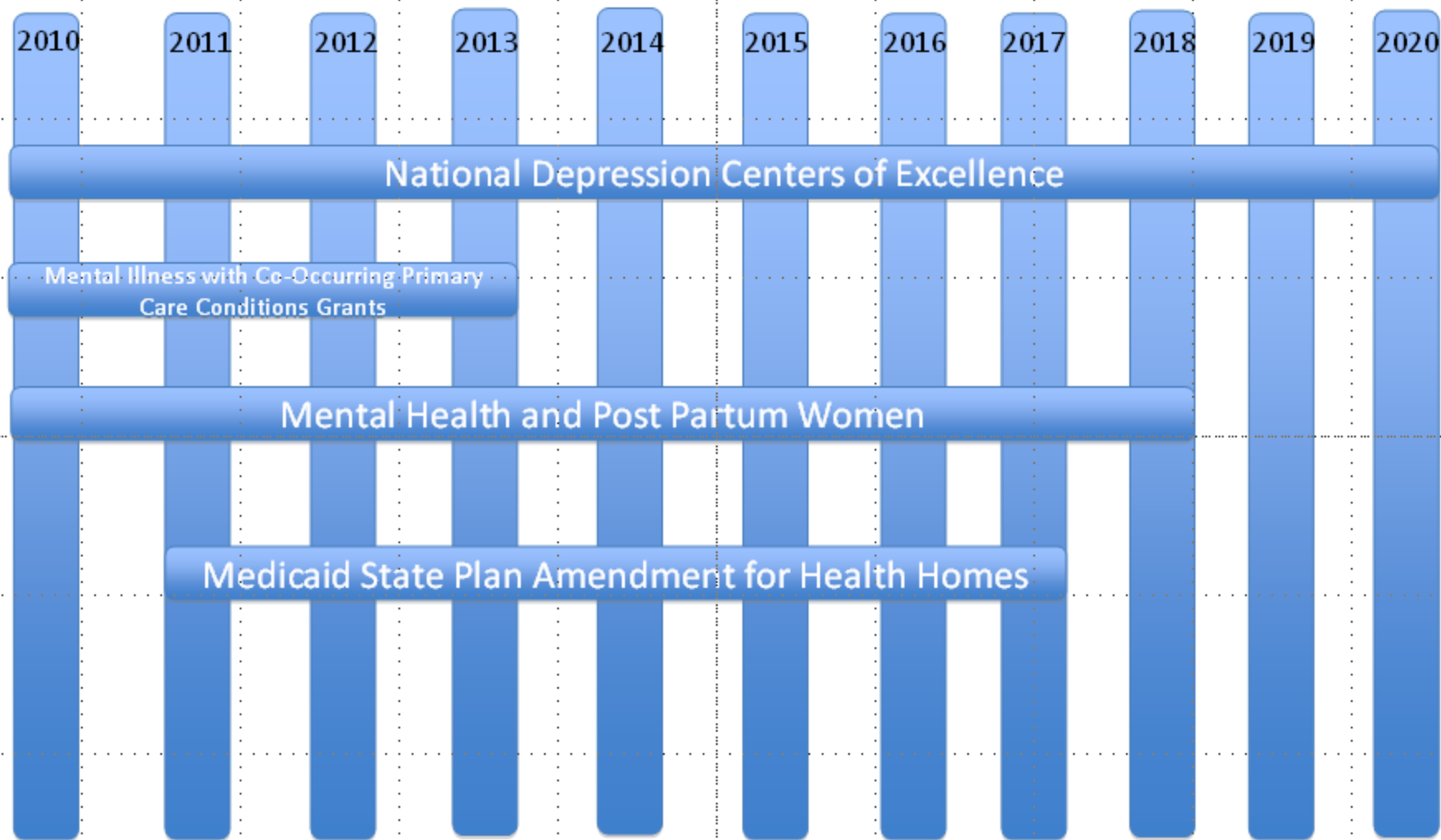

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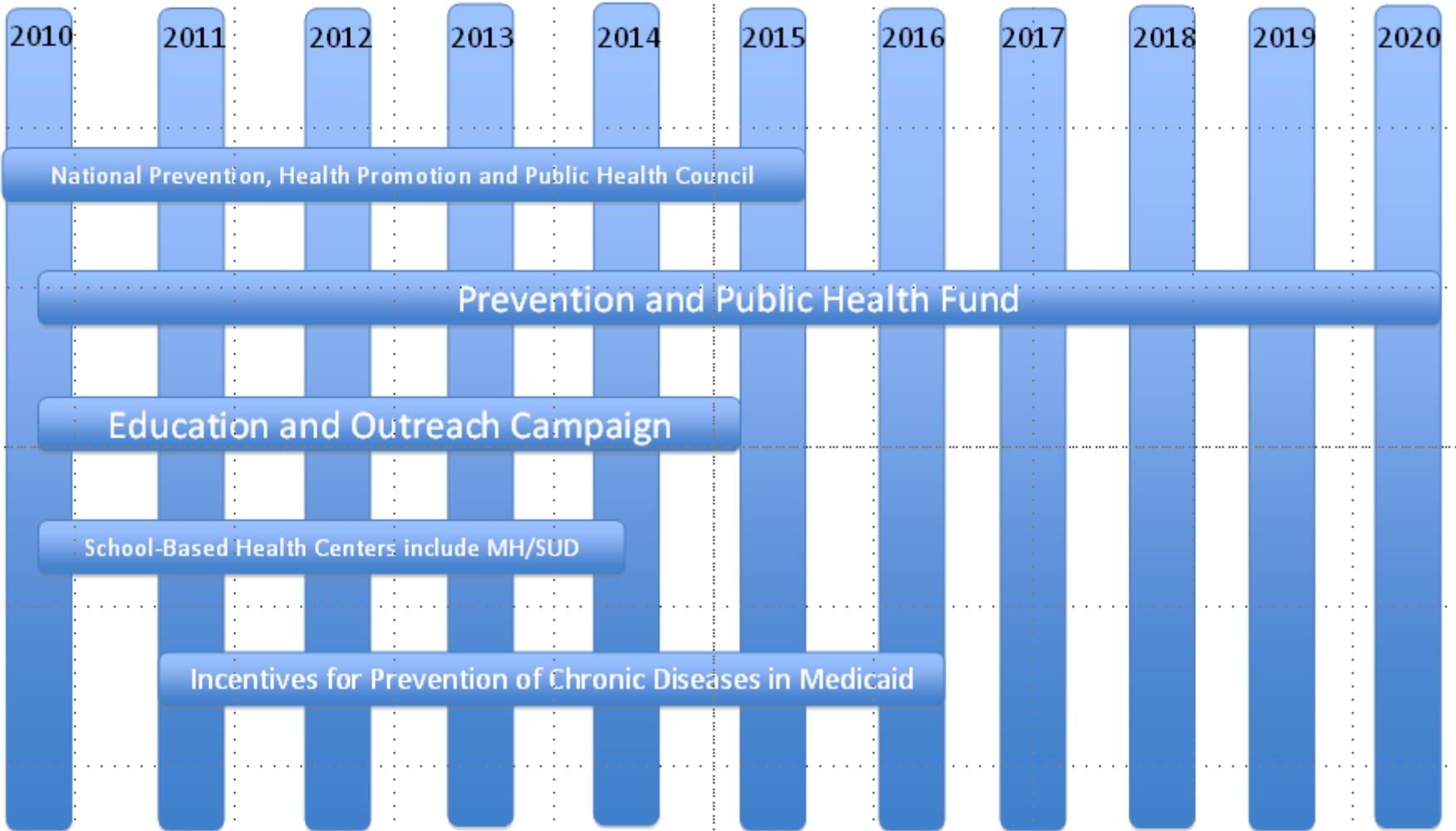
## Timeline for SAMHSA Specific Provisions



# Timeline for SAMHSA Specific Provisions

- **National Depression Center of Excellence- Sec. 10410 Pg 866**
  - No more than 20 Centers established by 3/23/2011.
  - Secretary to make recommendations to Centers for improvement by 9/30/2015
  - No more than 30 Centers Established by 9/30/2016
  - FY2011 – FY2015 \$100 million
  - FY2016 – FY2020 \$150 million
  - 5-year grants that can be renewed for an additional 5 years.
- **Mental Illness with Co-Occurring Primary Care Conditions Grants – Sec. 5604 Pg561 foreign**
  - FY2010 \$50 million
  - FY2011 – FY2014 sums as may be necessary
- **Mental Health and Post Partum Women - Sec 2952 Pg226**
  - Study FY2010 – FY2019, report due no later than 5 years after enactment
- **Medicaid State Plan Amendment for Health Homes – Sec. 2703 Pg 201**
  - Beginning 1/1/2011 states have option for state plan amendment, Secretary can award planning grants
    - 1/1/2014 survey states using state plan
  - By 1/1/2017 Secretary must complete an evaluation report to Congress
  - Primary Care Extension Program
    - FY2011 and FY2012 \$120 million
    - FY2013 and FY2014 such sums necessary
    - 2 year planning grants and 6 year program grants

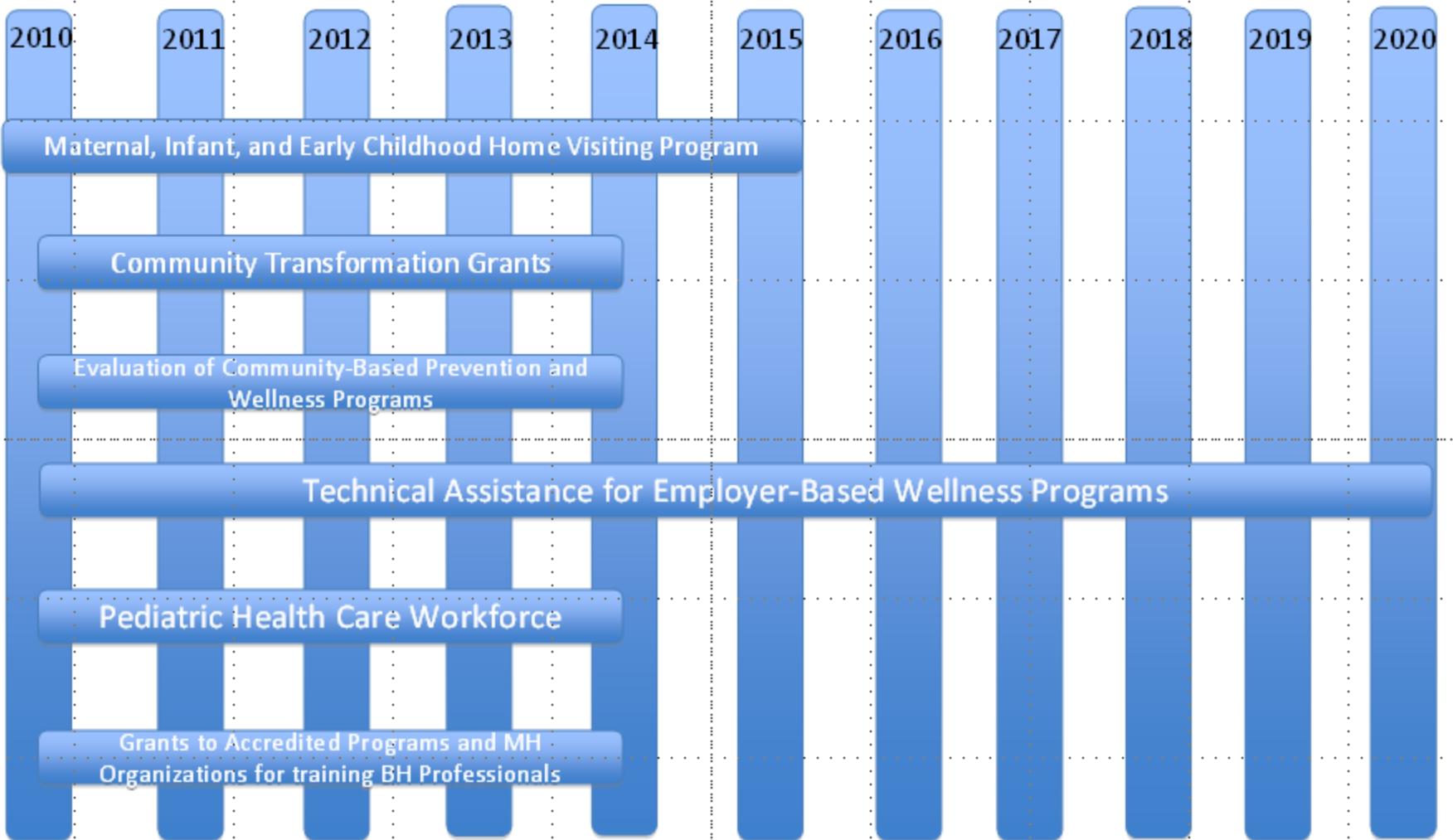

# Prevention Related Initiatives

- **National Prevention, Health Promotion and Public Health Council – Sec. 4001 Pg 420**
  - No later than 1 year after enactment develop and make public a national prevention, health promotion and public health strategy
  - 7/1/2010 – 1/1/2015 submit report to President and Congress annually
- **Prevention and Public Health Fund – Sec. 4002 Pg 423**
  - FY2010 \$500 million                      FY2011 \$750 million
  - FY2012 \$1 billion                              FY2013 \$1.25 billion
  - FY2014 \$1.5 billion                              FY2015 and thereafter \$2 billion
- **Education and Outreach Campaign Regarding Prevention Benefits – Sec. 4004 Pg 426**
  - No later than 1 year after enactment establish media campaign through the CDC
  - Evaluate and report to Congress every two years
- **School-Based Health Centers include Mental Health/Substance Use Disorders – Sec. 4101 Pg 428**
  - Grants FY2010 – FY2014
- **Incentives for Prevention of Chronic Diseases in Medicaid – Sec. 4108 Pg 443**
  - 1/1/2011 – 1/1/2016
  - State Report on semi-annual basis
  - 1/1/2014 Secretary’s initial report due to Congress
  - 1/1/2016 Final report due to Congress

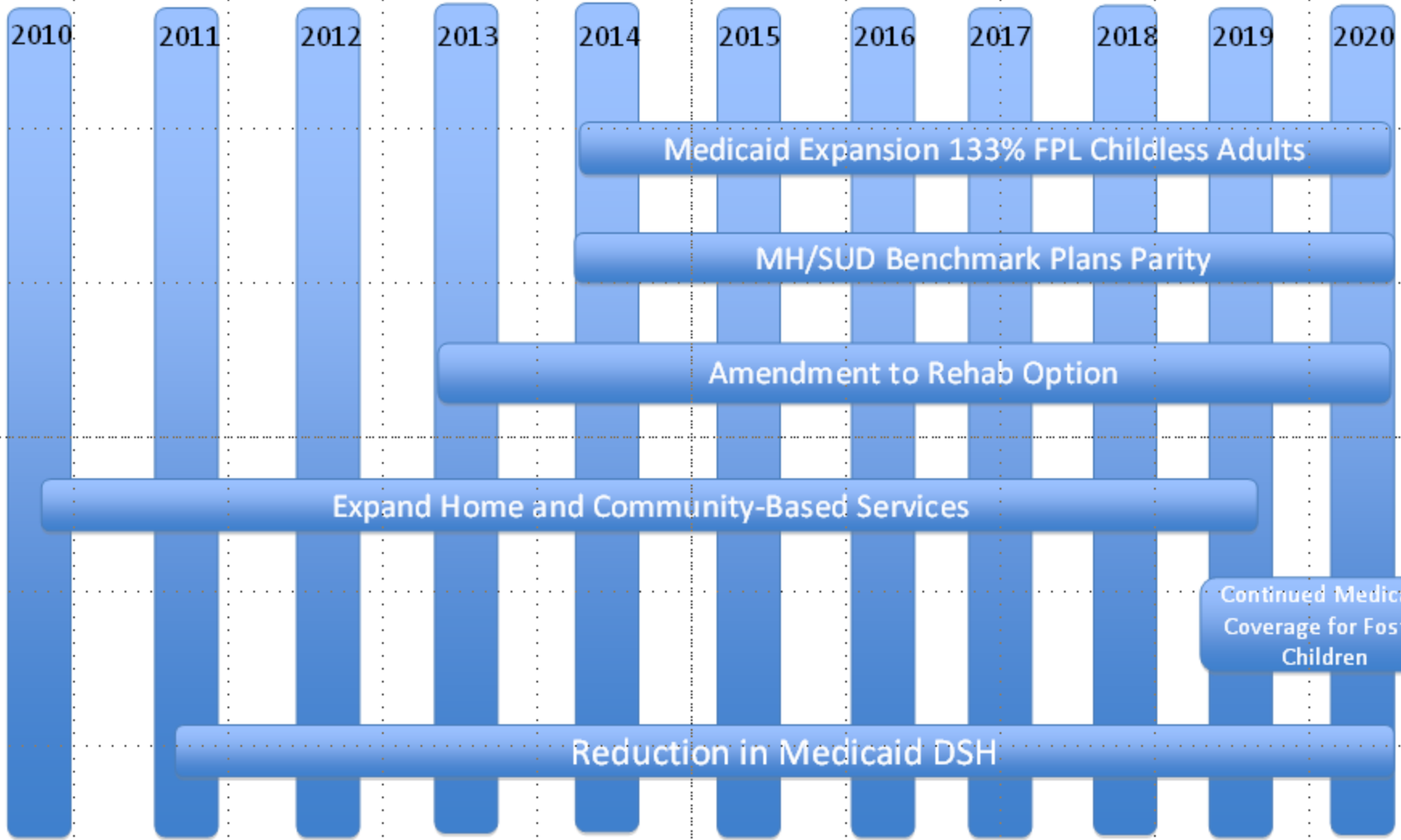

# Prevention Related Initiatives

- **U Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program– Sec. 2951 Pg 216**
  - No later than 6 months after enactment States conduct a needs assessment
  - Report due 3 years after the initial start of the program
  - Final report due 12/31/2015
  - FY2010 \$100 million      FY2011 \$250 million
  - FY2012 \$350 million      FY2013 \$400 million
  - FY2014 \$400 million
- **Community Transformation Grants – Sec. 4201 Pg 446**
  - FY2010 – FY2014
- **Evaluation of Community-Based Prevention and Wellness Programs for Medicare Beneficiaries – Sec. 4202 Pg 448**
  - FY2010 – FY2014
  - Report due no later than 9/30/2013
- **Technical Assistance for Employer-Based Wellness Programs – Sec. 4302 Pg 465**
  - No later than 3/23/2012 conduct national worksite health policies and programs survey
- **Pediatric Health Care Workforce – Sec. 5201 Pg 489**
  - FY2010 – FY2014 Pediatric specialty loan repayment plan for those providing child and adolescent mental and behavioral health
- **Grants to Accredited Programs and Mental Health Organizations for training Behavioral Health Professionals – Sec. 5306 Pg 508**
  - FY2010 – FY2013 Varied Amounts Available se these bullets to define data presented in previous chart

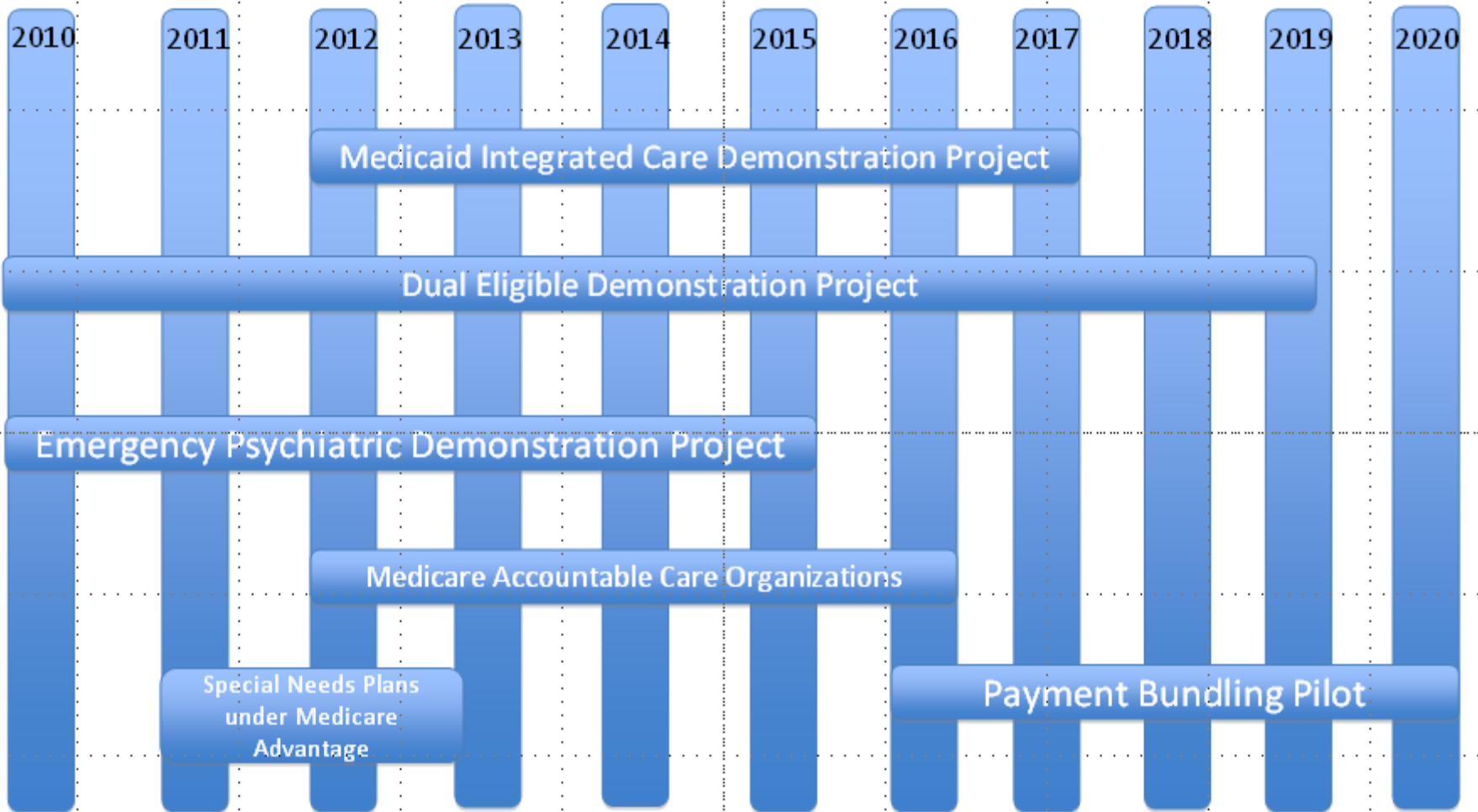

# Medicaid Provisions

- **Medicaid Expansion to Childless Adults under 133% FPL – Sec. 2001 Pg 153, Sec. 1201 Pg 23 in Reconciliation Bill**
  - Increased FMAP amounts for expansion population
  - 2014 – 2016 100% FMAP
  - 2017 95%
  - 2018 94%
  - 2019 and thereafter 90%
- **Benchmark Plans: Mental Health/Substance Use Disorder at Parity – Sec. 2001 Pg159**
  - 1/1/2014
- **Amendment to Rehabilitation Option under Medicaid – Sec. 4106 Pg 441**
  - 1/1/2013
- **Expand Home and Community-Based Services – Sec. 2402 Pg 183**
  - FY2011 enacted
  - State can participate for a five year period and can renew for an additional five years
- **Continued Medicaid Coverage for Foster Children – Sec. 2004 Pg 165**
  - 1/1/2019
- **Reduction in Medicaid DSH – Sec. 2551 Pg 194**
  - 10/1/2011- Reductions based on State uninsured levels

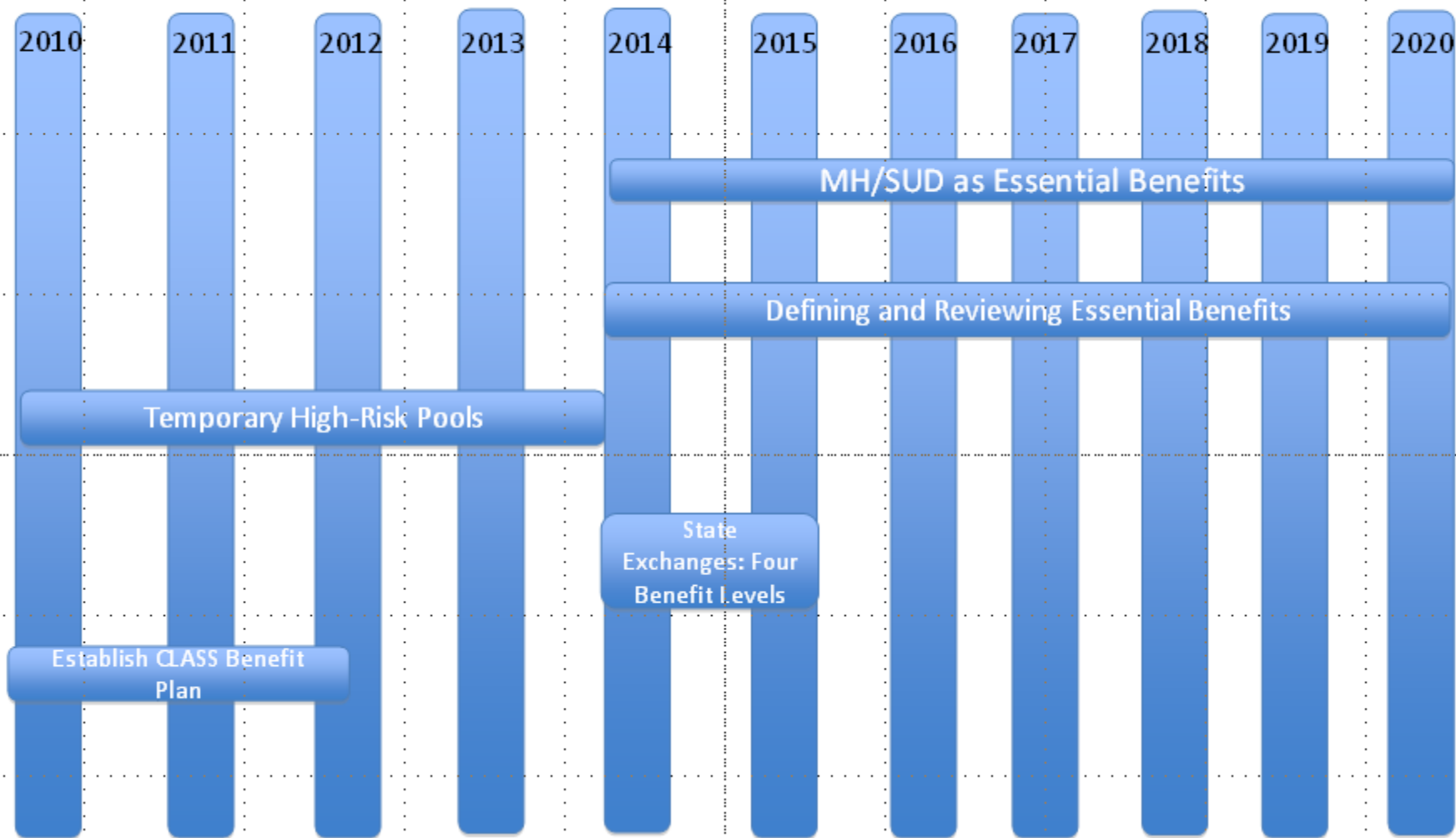

- **Medicaid Expansion to Childless Adults under 133% FPL – Sec. 2001 Pg 153, Sec. 1201 Pg 23 in Reconciliation Bill**
  - Increased FMAP amounts for expansion population

# **Timeline for Healthcare Reform Exchanges, High Risk Pools, and CLASS Act**

- **Mental Health/Substance Use Disorder as Essential Benefits**  
– **Sec. 1311 Pg 63**
- **Defining Essential Benefits – Sec. 1302 Pg 45 and Sec. 1004 Pg 7 in Reconciliation Bill**
  - Secretary reviews annually beginning 1/1/2014
- **Temporary High-Risk Pools – 1101 Pg 23**
  - 90 days after March 23,2010 – 1/1/14
- **State Exchanges: Four Benefit Levels – Sec. 1302 Pg 49**
  - Enacted 1/1/2014
- **Community Living Assistance Services and Supports (CLASS)**  
– **Sec. 8001 Pg 710**
  - No later than 10/1/2012 designate CLASS Independent Benefit Plan
