## Public Social Welfare Expenditures, Fiscal Year 1985: Overview\*

During fiscal year 1985, Federal, State, and local governments spent \$727.9 billion on public social welfare expenditures.<sup>1</sup> In current dollars, this amount represents an increase of \$56.9 billion, or 8.5 percent, over the 1984 figure. In constant (1985) dollars,

Social welfare expenditures are defined as the cost of cash benefits, services, and administration of programs operating under public law that are of direct benefit to individuals or families. however, the increase is \$33.3 billion—4.8 percent more than the previous year's figure. Table 1 shows expenditures for selected fiscal years 1950-85.

Spending for social welfare accounted for 18.4 percent of the gross national product (GNP) in 1985. This figure is similar to the percentage recorded in the years 1977-81, and it is nearly a percentage point lower than in 1983.

Social welfare as a percentage of government spending for all purposes has been declining since the 1976 level of 60.3 percent and reached 51.6 percent in 1985. State and local governments spent a higher percentage of their funds on social welfare than did the Federal Government—59 percent, compared with 48 percent.

The distribution of spending among program categories in 1985 changed only slightly from the previous year. Social insurance programs accounted for about half of the total, education for less than onefourth of the total, and public aid for 13 percent.
