## Public Social Welfare Expenditures, Fiscal Year 1989

Expenditures for social welfare under public law amounted to \$955.9 billion in fiscal year 1989, an increase of 7.9 percent over the previous year. The 1989 amount represented 18.6 percent of the national output of goods and services, as measured by the gross national product (GNP). Social insurance programs accounted for about one-half of all expenditures, followed in importance by the education and public aid categories.

Social welfare expenditures, which are defined in this series as the cash benefits, services, and administrative costs of public programs that directly benefit individuals and families, have been relatively stable since the early 1980's. The average annual growth in social welfare spending from 1982 to 1988 was 6.9 percent, and such spending represented between 18.4 percent and 19.5 percent of the GNP. The 1989 data continue this pattern.

Table 1 shows the individual components of the series and the changes that took place from year to year. The data for 1985-88 have been revised, particularly in the area of health and medical care. These revisions are in accordance with those made by the Office of the Actuary, Health Care Financing Administration, and the main categories affected are "Public aid" and "Health and medical programs."

Overall spending for social welfare rose \$69.7 billion from 1988 to 1989. Of that increase, \$34.0 billion—48.8 percent—was accounted for by social insurance expenditures. The Social Security program (Old-Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance) and the Medicare program (Hospital Insurance and Supplementary Medical Insurance) together were responsible for \$24.1 billion, or 34.5 percent of the entire increase.

Public aid spending rose \$9.0 billion in 1989, accounting for 12.9 percent of the total increase. Most of the growth was in the area of medical assistance payments, which made up slightly more than one-half of all public aid expenditures in that year.

The education category was second only to social insurance in the size of its increase, \$19.2 billion or 27.6 percent of the total. The bulk of this increased spending was at the elementary and secondary levels.

Table 2 shows the relationship of social welfare expenditures to the GNP. The 1989 ratio of 18.6 percent was typical of the 1980's; the average for the decade was 18.7 percent.

Social welfare spending per capita was \$3,783 in 1989, 6.9 percent higher than in 1988 (table 3). In constant (1989) dollars the increase was reduced to 2 percent. With the effects of inflation removed, all of the categories except "Veterans' programs" showed growth from 1988 to 1989. The comprehensive category of "All health and medical care," which includes medical spending from all programs, grew 4.9 percent in real terms, more than twice the overall average.

In 1989, the Federal Government share of all social welfare expenditures was 58.9 percent, down slightly from the previous year (table 4). Federal responsibility for spending varied considerably by category, however. Social insurance has traditionally been heavily federally funded; since 1966, the percentage ranged from 80 percent to 84 percent of the total. The 1989 figure was 82.7 percent. Veterans' programs have always been primarily federally financed as well, while education has been largely the responsibility of State and local governments. Those trends continued in 1989, with the Federal Government paying for 98.5 percent of veterans' expenditures, but only 7.8 percent of expenditures for education.

States and localities spent comparatively more money on housing as the decade progressed. In 1980, the Federal Government paid 91.3 percent of the housing bill; by 1989, that share was 83.8 percent. The same was true in the area of "Other social welfare;" the Federal share dropped from 64.6 percent in 1980 to 51.1 percent in 1989. The Federal share of the "health and medical care" category was 42.6 percent in 1989. The comprehensive category of "All health and medical care," however, which includes the Medicare program, was nearly 69 percent federally financed in the same year.

Table 5 concerns social welfare as a percentage of all government expenditures. More than one-half of all government spending was for social welfare programs in 1989; 49 percent of Federal and 60 percent of State and local money went for these purposes. Nearly one-third of Federal spending on social welfare came from trust funds. The equivalent figure for States and localities was about 10 percent. The picture is reversed for non-trust fund spending; about one-fourth of Federal money went for social welfare, compared with more than one-half of

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State and local funds. This disparity reflects the large Social Security trust funds and the fact that Federal nontrust fund spending includes defense expenditures.

Governments at all levels spent

\$241.7 billion on health and medical care in 1989, 10.8 percent more than in the previous year (table 6). The increasing cost of medical care is shown in the rise in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) between 1988 and 1989. The CPI as a whole rose 4.8 percent, while its medical care component rose 7.7 percent. Spending for health and medical care represented 4.7 percent of GNP in 1989, slightly higher than in the previous year.
