Overview of Public Social Welfare Expenditures, Fiscal Year 1990

During fiscal year 1990, Federal, State, and local governments spent \$1,045.4 billion on public social welfare expenditures; that is, the cost of cash benefits, services, and administration of programs operating under public law that are of direct benefit to individuals and families. The 1990 total was \$87.9 billion, or 9.2 percent higher than the amount spent the previous year. In constant (1990) dollars, the increase was \$39.9 billion, or 4.0 percent of the 1989 amount. Table 1 shows current dollar expenditures for fiscal years 1965 to 1990.

Table 1 also presents social welfare spending as a percent of both gross national product (GNP) and gross domestic product (GDP). In December of

1991, the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA), Department of Commerce, announced a revision of the National Income and Product Accounts (NIPA) that included a switch from GNP to GDP as the primary measure of production. Most U.S. Government statistical systems have since followed suit.

The essential difference between GNP and GDP is that GDP measures goods and services produced by labor and property located in the United States, regardless of the residency status of the workers or owners, while GNP measures those produced by labor and property supplied by U.S. residents, regardless of their geographic location. The GDP is, therefore, more consistent in coverage with other indicators such as employment, industry output, and capital investment, which are concerned solely with the United States. In addition, virtually all other countries have adopted GDP as their primary measure of production. The BEA action therefore facilitates U.S. entry into international economic accounting and

comparisons. The data in table 1 show that while social welfare spending may represent a slightly larger or smaller percent of the GNP or GDP in a given year, the year-to-year trends are not affected. In 1990, social welfare accounted for 19.1 percent of both GNP and GDP, up half a percentage point from the year before.

The percent of all government spending devoted to social welfare rose from 1989 to 1990, reaching 56.6 percent. State and local governments spent proportionally more (68 percent) of their funds for this purpose than did the Federal Government (51 percent). State and local governments, of course, have no expenditures for defense or international relations.

Social insurance expenditures accounted for nearly one-half of all social welfare spending in 1990. Education represented one-fourth of the total, and public aid represented a further one-seventh. All health and medical expenditures combined accounted for one-fourth of social welfare spending.
