CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

THREE ORDERS TO FILE TIMELY FORM 4 STATEMENTS ENTERED

The Commission today announced that the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered Final Orders against Henry L. Lee, Jr., Michael Industries, Inc., and William Ziegler, III, ordering them in the future to file timely Form 4 Statements of Changes in Beneficial Ownership of Securities as required by Section 16(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, Rule 16a-1 and Form 4. The Final Orders were entered in three separate and unrelated civil actions filed today by the Commission. Simultaneous with the filing of the actions, the defendants, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Complaints, consented to the Final Orders.

These cases are a product of the Commission's continuous monitoring of the filing of Form 3 Initial Statements of Beneficial Ownership of Securities and Form 4 Statements of Changes in Beneficial Ownership of Securities. The Commission and its staff will continue to provide guidance to persons who are unfamiliar with the filing requirements. (Attention is directed to Interpretive Release on Rules Applicable to Insider Reporting and Trading, [Rel. 34-18114, October 1, 1981]. However, those who fail to file such statements or persist in making delinquent filings may find themselves the subject of appropriate enforcement proceedings. (SEC v. Henry L. Lee, Jr., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 86-2213; SEC v. Michael Industries, Inc., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 86-2215). (LR-11191)

FRED A. HOWARD ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on July 28 the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Arkansas, Ft. Smith Division, entered an Order of Permanent Injunction against Fred A. Howard of McPherson, Kansas. The order permanently enjoins Howard from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Howard consented to the order without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, which was filed on January 21.

The complaint alleged that: (1) at various times between November 1979 and February 1984, Howard, along with two other named defendants, offered and sold demand promissory notes issued by Farmers Co-Op of Arkansas and Oklahoma, raising approximaterly \$9 million, in violation of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws; (2) approximately \$6 million of investor funds was invested in undisclosed and unprofitable loans to White Flame Fuels, Inc., a gasohol company; and (3) Howard misrepresented and omitted to state material facts in the offer and sale of the promissory notes, including the financial condition of Co-Op, the security of the investment, and the rate of return offered by Co-Op. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

CHARLES BYERS INDICTED

The Philadelphia Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Western District of Pennsylvania announced that on July 24 a federal grand jury sitting in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania returned an indictment charging Charles Byers, of Monongahela, Pennsylvania, with 30 counts of mail fraud. The indictment alleges that Byers, and others, doing business as KLC Business Associates, employed a scheme and artifice to defraud investors in connection with the offer and sale of fraudulent, unregistered certificates and other investment contracts. Byers is alleged to have operated a Ponzi scheme from June 1982 until November 20, 1984, in which approximately 395 investors invested more than \$1,386,870 and suffered a combined loss of approximately \$919,966. ORDER GRANTING EXEMPTION

The Division of Market Regulation granted the request of the Midwest Stock Exchange for an exemption under Section 15(b)(9) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 on behalf of its members who transact business on the MSE-Toronto Stock Exchange trading linkage from the requirement of Section 15(b)(8) of the Act. Section 15(b)(8) requires all broker-dealers who transact business other than on an exchange of which thay are a member to join a registered national securities association. (Rel. 34-23503)
