## RESPONDENT ASPEN TECHNOLOGY, INC.'S MOTION FOR FURTHER EXTENSION OF DISCOVERY DEADLINE

Respondent Aspen Technology, Inc. ("AspenTech") respectfully requests that the close of discovery for the limited purpose of obtaining discovery from Heat Transfer Research, Inc. ("HTRI") on heat transfer software be extended until April 9, 2004.

Pursuant to Your Honor's March 2, 2004 order, AspenTech promptly served a subpoena *Duces Tecum* on HTRI and a subpoena *Ad Testificandum* on Mr. Fernando Aguirre, whom Complaint Counsel has designated as a witness. HTRI has indicated that it will be unable to comply with these discovery requests by the current March 25, 2004 deadline and that Mr. Aguirre will not be available for deposition until the week ending April 9, 2004. Accordingly, AspenTech requests that the close of discovery for the limited purpose of obtaining discovery from HTRI on heat transfer software be extended until April 9, 2004. This extension is necessary to obtain discovery from HTRI so that AspenTech may prepare a defense to Complaint Counsel's new allegation related to thermal design software.

The Scheduling Order may be modified "upon a showing of good cause." Rule 3.21, 16 C.F.R. 3.21. AspenTech submits that the inability of HTRI to comply with the discovery requests in a timely manner constitutes good cause. These extensions will not affect any other deadline on the recently modified scheduling order. Complaint Counsel have

indicated, without approving any of the foregoing assertions in this motion, that they do not oppose the extension of discovery for the limited purpose of obtaining discovery from HTRI to April 9, 2004.
