SUBJECT: Deputy Secretary of Defense

References: (a) DoD Directive 5105.02, "Deputy Secretary of Defense," May 31, 2011 (hereby cancelled)

(c) Title 31, United States Code

1. PURPOSE. This Directive reissues Reference (a) to update the responsibilities and functions of the Deputy Secretary of Defense in accordance with the authorities in References (b), (c), and (d).

2. APPLICABILITY. This Directive applies to OSD, the Military Departments, the Office of the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Joint Staff, the Combatant Commands, the Office of the Inspector General of the Department of Defense, the Defense Agencies, the DoD Field Activities, and all other organizational entities within the DoD (hereinafter referred to collectively as the "DoD Components").

3. RESPONSIBILITIES AND FUNCTIONS

a. In accordance with the authorities contained in Reference (b), (c), and (d) and except as expressly prohibited by law, Deputy Secretary of Defense Ashton B. Carter, has full power and authority to act for the Secretary of Defense and to exercise the powers of the Secretary of Defense upon any and all matters concerning which the Secretary of Defense is authorized to act pursuant to law. Included, without limitation, in these authorities is serving as the Chief Management Officer of the Department of Defense and the Chief Operating Officer of the Department of Defense, who shall:

(1) Ensure DoD-wide capability to carry out the strategic plan of the DoD in support of national security objectives.

(2) Ensure the core DoD business missions are optimally aligned to support the DoD warfighting mission.


(3) Improve DoD management and performance, pursuant to section 1123 of Reference (c).

(4) Develop and maintain a strategic plan pursuant to section 306 of Reference (d).

b. The all-inclusive authority reflected in paragraph 3.a. may not be further delegated in its entirety; however, the Deputy Secretary of Defense is authorized, except where otherwise restricted, to make specific written delegations.

5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Directive is effective upon its publication to the DoD Issuances Website.
