CERT Impetus



What was the impetus for CERT?

- At least 9,000 (maybe as many as 100,000)
 killed in 1985 Mexico City earthquake
 - 700 saved by untrained volunteers
 - 100 volunteers died trying to help
- City of Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD) recognized that citizens likely to be on their own during early stages of disaster
- Piloted CERT training in 1986

How did the CERT Program spread?

- Other jurisdictions adapted CERT model for earthquake response to their communities.
- Orlando (FL) then adapted CERT model for hurricane response
- Early 1990s Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) felt that CERT should be made available to communities nationwide
- 1994 Emergency Management Institute (EMI) at FEMA began conducting CERT Train-the-Trainer course
