



A hierarchy of service trade data.




Services output has been growing more rapidly than other major sectors of the economy for decades.

Composition Of U.S. GDP by Major Product Group: 1929-2010




In 1947 services output accounted for roughly 48% of total output. Today the services share is nearly 69%.

U.S. Domestic Product by Industry: 1947-2010





U.S. sales of services through foreign affiliates of U.S. MNCs is now much larger than U.S. cross-border service exports



Foreign-owned affiliates in the U.S. provide more services to U.S. customers than do cross-border service imports.


Sales of Services to U.S. Markets Through Cross- Border Trade and **Through Foreign Affiliates In the United States**


Exports and imports of services have both recovered since a fall in 2009.

U.S. Cross-Border Exports of Services Totaled \$530 Billion in 2010





Details on BPT services exports first became available in 2001




Details on "other BPT services" exports first became available in 2006

Exports of "other BPT services" reached \$53.6 billion in 2010




Business, Professional and Technical Services was the largest category in U.S. cross-border imports in 2010

U.S. Cross-Border Imports of Services Totaled \$368 Billion in 2010








The installation, repair & maintenance of equipment is the largest category of "other BPT services" imports.

Imports of "other BPT services" totaled \$27.7 billion in 2010



Of the \$530 billion in U.S. cross-border services exports in 2010, 55% went to the top 10 export markets.



Of the \$368 billion in U.S. cross-border services imports in 2010, 58% came from the top 10 import markets.
