A Primer for Using HSIN Connect to View Webinars





- A webinar is a web-based informational or training seminar that is transmitted over the internet.
 - Webinars can be in the form of a presentation, lecture, meeting, workshop or seminar.
- A webinar enables presenters from across the country to communicate through both audio and visuals in one virtual space to hundreds of viewers at one time.





What is HSIN Connect?

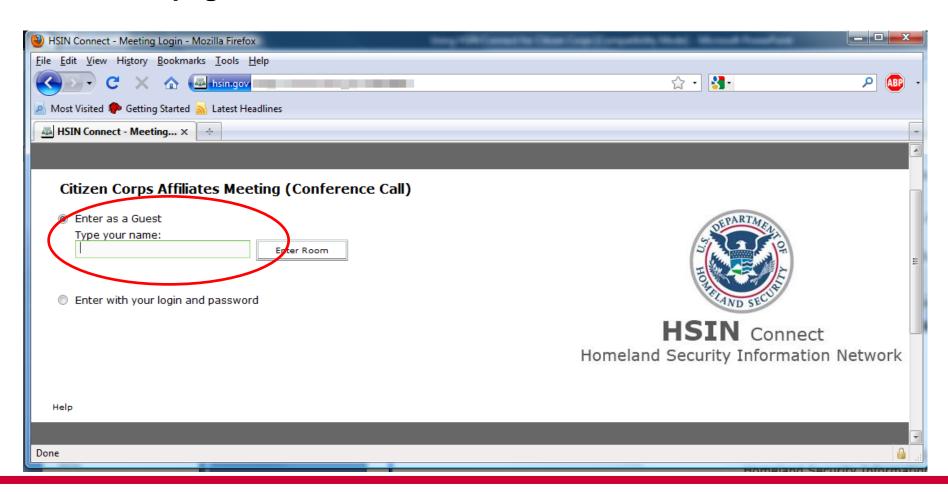
- HSIN Connect is a web-based, webinar system similar to "Go To Meeting"
- HSIN Connect allows anyone with a computer and internet connection to view and participate in online presentations and discussions
- HSIN Connect integrates PowerPoint viewing, voice and video features, chat, and file sharing
- It is free to use for everyone
- To host a meeting, all you need is a HSIN login
- To view a meeting, all you need is a computer with an internet connection (and preferably speakers and a microphone)





How to use HSIN Connect

- Go to the link provided to you for the webinar.
 - The page will look similar to the one below.



Logging into HSIN Connect

If you do not have a HSIN login:

In the space where it says "Guest", type in your name in the following format:

First Name, Last Name, dash, Email

For example:

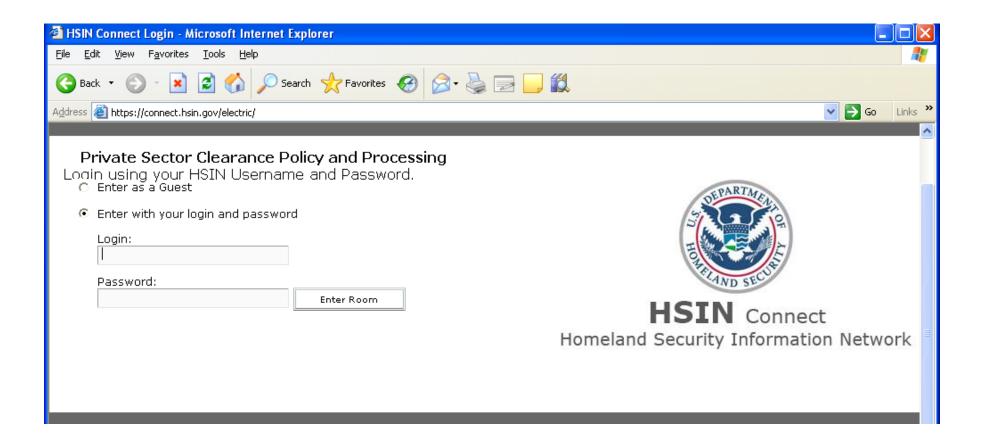
John Doe – John.Doe@dhs.gov

If you do have a HSIN Login, type in your HSIN login and password, as shown on the following slide





Logging into HSIN Connect





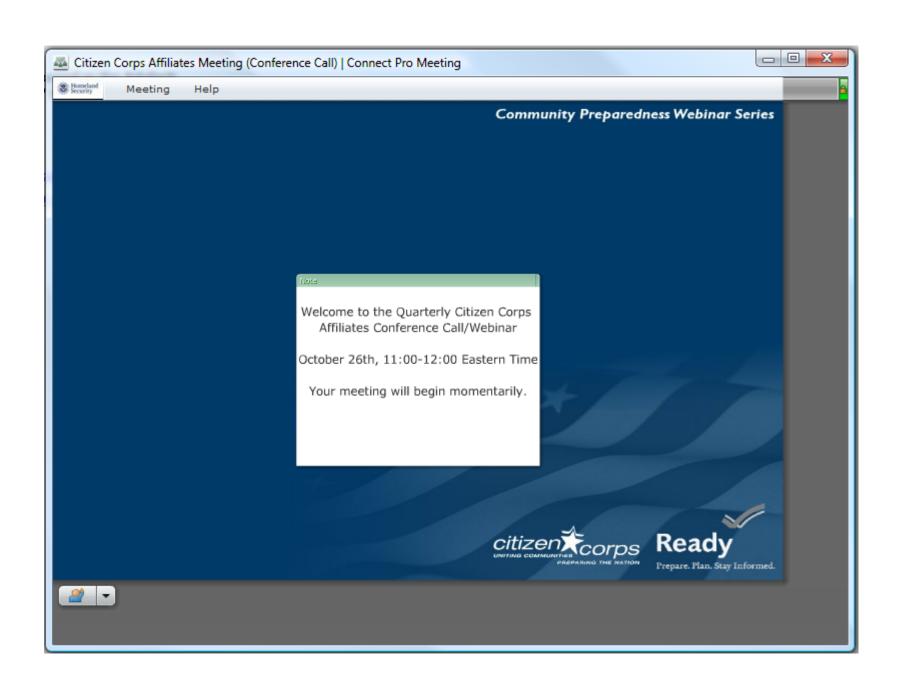


Using HSIN Connect

- HSIN Connect will automatically load. Ensure you have:
 - Adobe Flash installed
 - All popup blockers disabled
 - Javascript Enabled
 - Speakers (highly recommended) and microphone (optional) enabled and attached to your computer
- Once you log on...
 - Immediately after a user logs into HSIN, he/she should see a screen that is similar to the screen on the following slide.
 - If the user can view this screen then he/she has logged in successfully.







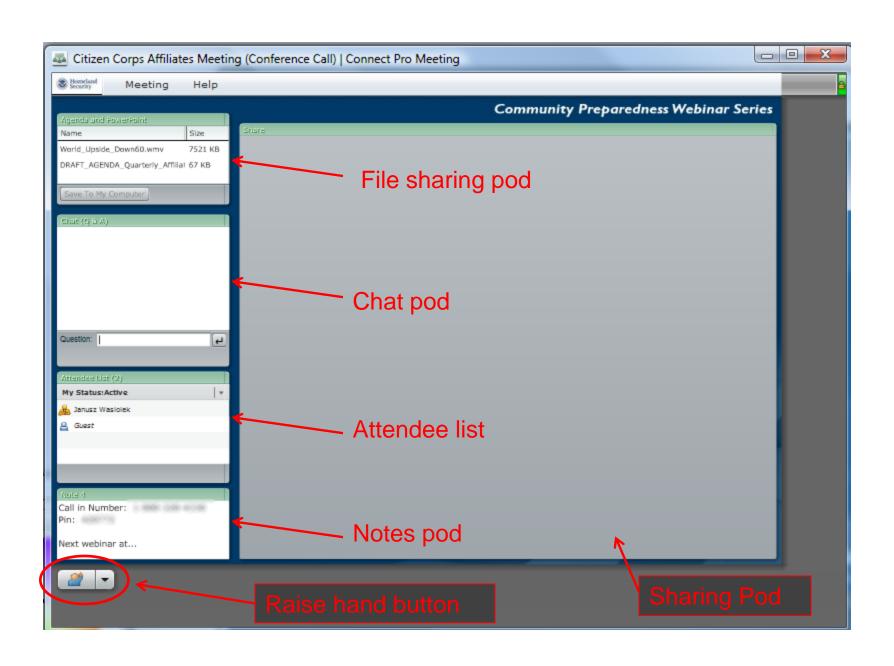


Navigating within HSIN Connect

- HSIN Connect is composed of a series of windows (also known as "pods")
 - Each pod has a different function
- As a guest user, you <u>DO NOT</u> have control over the location of each pod
- An example of some of the pods you may see is on the following slide

What can you do as a guest?

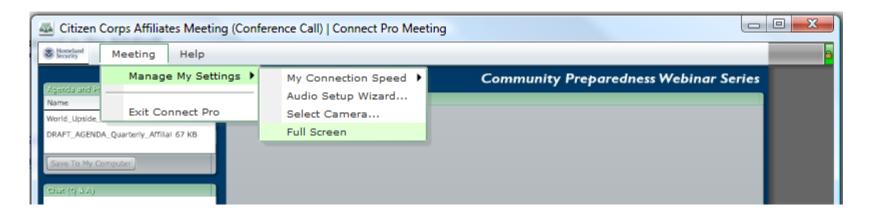
- As a guest user...
 - You can save files in the shared documents pod to your computer by clicking on the "Save to My Computer" button.
 - You can chat and/or ask the presenter or host a question via text
 - You can raise your hand to be allowed to use your microphone and talk with the presenter or host
 - You can participate in polls or surveys





Tips and Tricks

- Make sure your computer speakers and microphone are enabled and working prior to the start of the webinar.
- Space is limited in each webinar, it is recommended that you login 5-10 minutes prior to the start of the webinar.
- For optimum viewing experience, set your window to "Full Screen" mode (see below)







Once the Webinar starts

- The presenter or host will start the meeting. A "share pod" will appear and a PowerPoint presentation will be shared with shared with the audience (see next page)
- The presenter or host has control over the slides





Ending the Meeting

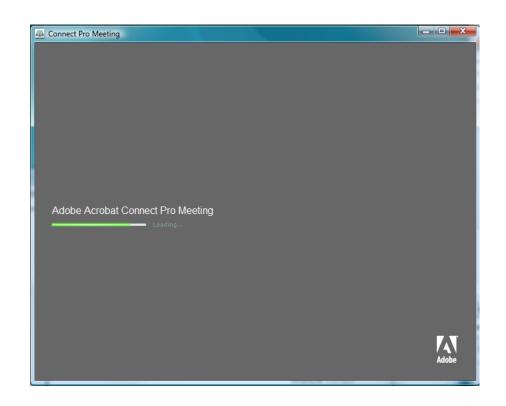
- Once the meeting is over, the host or presenter will end the meeting
- Just close the window to exit the HSIN Connect system
 - If you are a guest (no HSIN login), there is no need to log out
 - If you are using a HSIN login, please make sure to log out of the HSIN Connect system





Troubleshooting

- HSIN Connect occasionally has issues connecting
- The most common issue occurs during the grey loading screen
- If HSIN Connect fails to load after 2-3 minutes, please close your browser and click again on the link







Troubleshooting (continued)

- Other issues that may occur...
 - Using a non-mainstream browser
 - Not having Flash installed on your computer
 - Having Javascript disabled on your computer
 - Having an overly-aggressive popup blocker
 - Screen resolution set lower than 1024x768.
