This fact sheet presents recent **employment and unemployment** figures for New York City, New York State, New Jersey, and the United States. The **Consumer Price Index** (CPI) measures price changes or inflation for particular commodities and services at the retail level. The **Producer Price Index** (PPI) measures price changes or inflation of particular commodities and services at the wholesale level and is widely used by business firms as an escalator in long-term contracts. The **Employment Cost Index (ECI)** measures price changes or inflation of labor costs which include wages and salaries and employer costs for employee benefits. The **Occupational Employment Statistics** (**OES**) program estimates occupational employment and wages for 22 major occupational groups and 801 detailed occupations in every state and metropolitan area. Data are not seasonally adjusted.



Median annual wages in New York-Northern New Jersey-Long Island


