



Trends in U.S. Public Awareness of Racial and Ethnic Health Disparities (1999–2010)

2009 General Population Toplines

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INTRODUCTION

This study is based on a national random sample of 2,996 telephone interviews with adults age 18 and over including 1,218 Whites, 806 African Americans, 620 Hispanic/Latinos, and 145 Asian American/Pacific Islanders. Interviews with the public were conducted in the respondent's language of choice using trained NORC interviewers for English and Spanish interviews and the Language Line Service for interviews in other languages. The surveys were designed, conducted, and analyzed by researchers at NORC in consultation with external technical advisors and OMH project leadership. The surveys were in the field from April – June, 2009. The margin of error for the public survey is +/- 3.5 percent for results based on the full sample, +/- 5.5 percent for the subsample of Whites, +/- 6.8 percent for African Americans, +/- 7.7 percent for Hispanics/Latinos, and +/- 16 percent for Asian Americans/Pacific Islanders.
