Chair Cynthia L. Bauerly called the Federal Election Commission to order in an open meeting at 10:06 A.M. on Thursday, September 22, 2011 with a quorum present.

Chair Bauerly welcomed Mr. Anthony Herman, the new General Counsel, to the Commission. Chair Bauerly noted that his experience as a litigator and agency advisor and his enthusiasm for public service make him an ideal candidate to lead the General Counsel's Office. The Chair also thanked Mr. Christopher Hughey who so ably served as Acting General Counsel during the time of transition.

II. DRAFT INTERPRETIVE RULE ON WHEN CERTAIN INDEPENDENT EXPENDITURES ARE "PUBLICLY DISSEMINATED" FOR REPORTING PURPOSES

<u>Agenda Document No. 11-52</u> (Held over from the meeting of September 1, 2011) **Chair Bauerly recognized Ms. Cheryl Hemsley of the General**

Counsel's Office who presented the subject document, which provides

guidance on the meaning of "publicly disseminated" for the purpose of

reporting certain independent expenditures under 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.4 and

109.10. Discussion followed.

Chair Bauerly recognized Commissioner Weintraub who

MOVED to approve Agenda Document No. 11-52, subject to the following edits:

1. On page 3, add a sentence to the end of footnote 1 to read:

This particular rule interprets "publicly disseminated" for those items that do not have an inherent date certain for public dissemination such as yard signs, mini-billboards, handbills, t-shirts, hats, and buttons.

2. On page 3, line 7, at the end of the sentence ending with "communications are actually disseminated to the public." add a new footnote 2 to read:

Once the public dissemination date is established, independent expenditure communications must be reported pursuant to 11 CFR 104.4(b)(2), (c), and (f) and 109.10(c) and (d).

connected organization, Dimension4, Inc. She summarized the conclusions

reached in Drafts A and B. Discussion followed.

Chair Bauerly recognized Commissioner Petersen who

MOVED approval of Draft Advisory Opinion 2011-16 Draft A which is set forth in Agenda Document No. 11-55.

The motion failed on a vote of 3-3 with Commissioners Hunter,

McGahn, and Petersen voting affirmatively for the motion. Commissioners Bauerly, Walther, and Weintraub dissented.

Chair Bauerly recognized Commissioner Weintraub who

MOVED approval of Draft B.

<u>The motion failed on a vote of 3-3</u> with Commissioners Bauerly, Walther, and Weintraub voting affirmatively for the motion. Commissioners Hunter, McGahn, and Petersen dissented. Chair Bauerly advised the General Counsel to provide a letter to the

requestor indicating that the Commission was not able to reach an answer

on its request.

Chair Bauerly noted that the Commission has recently settled and the Court has issued a stipulated judgment in <u>Carey v. FEC</u>. The Commission intends to consider the issues raised in that case along with those arising from the <u>SpeechNow</u> and <u>EMILY's List</u> decisions and hopes to move forward with a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking on those topics. In the meantime, the Commission is considering how to provide guidance for committees who want to follow in National Defense PAC's footsteps given the state of current rules and reporting forms which cannot be changed without a

rulemaking. The Commission hopes to have something available shortly.

Chair Bauerly recognized Commissioner Petersen who welcomed Mr.

Herman to the Commission, noting his wealth of experiences and

tremendous legal skills. Commissioner Petersen also thanked Mr. Hughey

for the excellent service he provided to the Commission as Acting General

Counsel for well over a year.
