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Moderator Biographies

Thomas Caulfield, Assistant Inspector General, Investigations, National Reconnaissance Office

Mr. Caulfield currently holds the position of the Assistant Inspector General for Investigation, Office of Inspector General (OIG), National Reconnaissance Office (NRO). He is a Senior Intelligence Services Officer with over 30 years government service all of which has been associated with law enforcement and investigation. He has been assigned to the NRO OIG for the last ten years. Mr. Caulfield holds various certifications that include Certified Fraud Examiner (CFE), Certified Inspector General (CIG), and Certified Inspector General for Investigation (CIGI) to name a few. He is a graduate from Wayland Baptist University and St. Leo College, where he received degrees in both criminology and criminal justice. Over the last eight years, Mr. Caulfield has been the Program Manager for a NRO OIG's procurement fraud focused initiative, designed specifically to prevent, deter, and detect procurement fraud. This initiative was developed by Mr. Caulfield and it caused a threefold increase in procurement fraud investigations being initiated by the NRO OIG, and the recovery of millions in fraudulent dollars. This procurement fraud initiative is a cross-functional effort involving all OIG business units, which includes Auditors, Inspectors, and Investigators.

James W. Desautel, Program Manager, Air Force Audit Agency

Mr. Desautel has 26 years experience with the Air Force Audit Agency (AFAA). Mr. Desautel is currently a Program Manager at the AFAA Mountain Area Audit Office in Colorado Springs, CO. He is a Certified Government Financial Manager and graduated from the University of Wyoming in 1973 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Accounting.

Robert Dillard, Assistant Director, Defense Hotline, Office of the Inspector General of the Department of Defense

Mr. Dillard joined the Department of Defense, Office of the Inspector General, as an Intelligence Evaluator after retiring from a career in the US Air Force of more than twenty years. He provides guidance and oversight to fraud agents throughout the US who are investigating allegations of complex economic crimes. Mr. Gressley enlisted in the US Air Force in 1978 and served as a Security Policeman at several locations until 1989 when he was selected for duty with AFOSI. From 1989 until May 1998, Mr. Gressley served as an investigator at various detachment levels and finally as a region operations superintendent. In Jun 1998, he retired from active duty and spent the next two years conducting Medicare fraud investigations. Mr. Gressley returned to AFOSI in Oct 2000 and has worked in the procurement fraud discipline. In November, 2005, he was selected to his current position as the Director, Fraud Investigations, 1st Field Investigations Region, Wright-Patterson AFB, OH. Special Agent Patrick O'Toole, Senior Criminal Investigator, Defense Criminal Investigative Service

Special Agent O'Toole is a Senior Criminal Investigator with the Defense Criminal Investigative Service. For the past three years he has been assigned to the FBI's Washington Field Office, Joint Terrorism Task Force, where he investigates international terrorism matters. His primary responsibility is to ensure DFAS Internal Review effectively carries out the Performance Review and Investigation missions. The performance review program is designed to foster DFAS-wide awareness that effective and efficient internal controls reduce risk, safeguard resources and improve overall DoD financial management. Investigations administer the DoD Hotline Program for DFAS and conducts investigations of potential fraud, waste, abuse, and misconduct related to DFAS and DoD financial management operations. Mr. Romesburg graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Accounting from California University of Pennsylvania in 1991. He is a Certified Public Accountant and Certified Internal Auditor. Mr. Romesburg began his government service with the Defense Logistics Agency's Internal Review Office in 1992. In 1994, he moved to the Department of Defense Inspector General, where he audited DoD financial management operations, including the department's financial statements. He began his service with DFAS in 1996 and joined the Internal Review organization in 2000 and has been in his current position since 2002.

Diane Stetler, Program Director, Contract Audit Policy & Oversight, Office of the Inspector General of the Department of Defense

As the Program Director for the Contract Audit Team of the Audit Policy and Oversight (APO) Directorate, Ms. Stetler is responsible for providing policy direction for and oversight of the Defense Contract Audit Agency (DCAA). DCAA is the largest Federal audit organization with over 3,500 auditors who are located at approximately 80 field offices in 6 regions and headquarters. Ms. Stetler also acted as the audit advisor to the Defense Criminal Investigative Service during which time she conducted training for all the criminal investigators on procurement fraud. Additionally, she was an expert witness in the successful prosecution of a major DoD contractor for a complex procurement fraud scheme. It was the largest case of its kind at the time and recouped over \$30 million in criminal and civil fines and penalties. She is currently a representative on the DoD Procurement Fraud Working Group which meets monthly to discuss issues relevant to the DoD audit, investigative, contracting, and legal communities. Ms. Stetler authored the Handbook on Contract Fraud and coauthored the Handbook on Fraud Indicators for Contract Auditors in 1993. Currently

she and her staff are updating the existing scenarios and indicators and drafted new ones. Ms. Stetler began her Government career with DCAA at a field office in the Fairfax, Virginia. She has a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration degree from Georgetown University and a Master of Science in Policy Management also from Georgetown University. Ms. Stetler is a Certified Public Accountant, a Certified Internal Auditor, and a Certified Defense Financial Auditor, Level II.
