Kim R. Widup, a career 1811 criminal investigator, was the United States Marshal for the Northern District of Illinois, Chicago, IL, until his retirement in December of 2009 after 31 years of federal law enforcement service. Widup was appointed to the U.S. Marshal position by President George W. Bush in March of 2002 and was confirmed by the United States Senate. During his time as U.S. Marshal, Widup dealt with several international and domestic terrorism trials and the murder of a federal district judge's husband and mother by a pro se litigant. Widup testified before the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee on courthouse security and protecting federal judges and served as the Chairman of the United States Marshals Service Shooting Review Board.

Prior to this position he was the Chief of Investigations for the Office of the Independent Counsel in the matter involving former President William Jefferson Clinton. Widup was a Special Agent and ultimately the Assistant Special Agent-in-Charge, for the Office of the Inspector General, Investigations, USDA, for 23 years where he led and supervised the investigation of the Secretary of Agriculture, his Chief of Staff and 18 other individuals and corporations.

Widup is currently an instructor for the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) Public Corruption Investigations Training Program and is an instructor on the conducting of public corruption and internal affairs investigations for the Suburban Law Enforcement Academy in Glen Ellyn, IL. Additionally, Widup instructs for the Association of Inspectors General and the National Internal Affairs Investigators Association. Finally, Widup currently serves as a Board Member (Commissioner) for the Cook County Sheriff's Merit Board and operates a consulting business, Widup Consulting, LLC, in Naperville, IL.
