Arthur "Art" Simril is an Investigator with the Hotline Division, Department of Defense, Office of the Inspector General. He is responsible for the receipt and processing of hotline complaints involving fraud, waste, abuse, mismanagement and other violations received from the public, Armed Forces personnel, various non-government entities as well as Members of Congress. He prepares and conducts Hotline initial and sustainment training for assigned personnel.

Mr. Simril retired from the U.S. Army in 2008 as a Chief Warrant Officer 4. He was a Special Agent assigned to the Army's Criminal Investigation Division (CID). With almost 25 years of investigative experience, Mr. Simril has conducted felony criminal investigations involving violations of military and federal law that involved persons, property, drug, white collar crimes and other sensitive matters. He has led several high profile criminal investigations including the abuse of prisoners at the Abu Ghraib Prison in Iraq. He has held progressively responsible positions including multiple tours as a Special Agent in Charge. He has been assigned as the Deputy Inspector General and Deputy Chief of Operations for CID command where he provided critical oversight and guidance to CID elements worldwide.

Mr. Simril holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Organization Security and Management from the University of Phoenix. He is also a graduate of many law enforcement and criminal investigative courses including the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Academy (203rd Session), the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Academy's Major Case Management Course, and the Army's Inspector General Academy.
